FIRE CHIEF

- MOTION: Mr. Blados moved to pay the City of Cleveland, Division of Water invoice \$4,393.48 for the annual Hydrant usage for 2020. (We have 182 hydrants in the village that Cleveland maintains). Second by Mr. Walsh Motion carried 4-0
- The Fire Department Kitchen remodel is underway and even though Chief Stefanko put the funds in his budget Mayor Procuk is asking for a motion to pay the invoices due to the costs.
 MOTION: Mr. Blados moved to pay invoices for the kitchen remodel at \$2,263.74 to date.

- NOPEC is again giving Brooklyn Heights an Energizer grant in the amount of \$7,458 for 2020 to make energy efficient improvements.

MAYORS REPORT

Attended the annual SCOG (Southwest Council of Governments) meeting last week. This
includes SERT, SEB, HazMat, SWAT etc. Fire yearly dues are \$10,000 and Police are asking for
an increase this year of \$250 bringing their annual dues to \$12,250. The armored vehicle sits on
a 1997 school bus chassis and they are in need of purchasing a new vehicle. The cost to our
village would be \$22,250 for the dues.

AUDIENCE

- Chelsea asked who will be the co-chair for the parks ad hoc committee. Mayor Procuk told her Councilman Blados is the new chairman. She asked if money has been put in the budget for the park and was told that the budget meetings have just begun and have to be complete by March 31st.
- Mr. Blados called an Ad Hoc Recreation Committee meeting for Feb. 18th at 7pm to discuss where the upper park projects stand.
- Linda Neyman asked about the progress of the problems on her cul-de-sac (Hilltop) and when they might be resolved? Mayor Procuk explained that Councilwoman Presot chairs the Safety Committee and she is presently out of town. He feels she will call a meeting for mid-February when she returns and this will be on the table.

Mr. Frank asked Law Director Dowling about signatures on the agreement with the Ohio Attorney General regarding the Ambulance Fee collection and Mr. Dowling said that neither Council nor he have the authority to enter into any agreement. Only the Mayor and / or the Clerk/Treasurer have that authority. Council Pro Tem Lasky, Mayor Procuk and Law Director Dowling signed the agreement.
