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# **General Topics**

- Ad Hoc Environment: Mayor Procuk is seeking additional Brownfield grant funding to remediate the lead on the village property purchased in 2001-2002.
- Finance Committee: The budget is due by March 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Income Tax Board of Review: subpoenas will ensure that R.I.T.A. is collecting all the taxed due Brooklyn Heights.
- Ordinance Committee: residents are asking council to make some changes. Number 1 on their list is that the storage of trash & recycling containers be stored out of sight from the curb.
- Safety Committee: will work on uniformity with "No Parking" signs throughout the village pertaining especially to the cul-de-sacs.
- Streets Committee: Mr. Henry and Mayor Procuk continue to seek grants and would like to work toward a three-five & ten year plan for completing street jobs.
- Ad Hoc Recreation Committee: will continue to evolve the upper park.

# **NIDEC AND BRILLIANT SIGN**

- NIDEC has been granted some variances which will become effective on January 9, 2020.
- Signage of the west elevation (facing Tuxedo) will be illuminated
- Signage on the east elevation will not take place at this time.
- Signage on the south elevation (facing I-480) will be a smaller illuminated sign
- Ground sign at the Tuxedo driveway entrance will be 5' x 6' illuminated and will include the address.
- Council was shown pictures of the signs.
- NIDEC hopes to move some warehouse employees in during February and the office in March.

- The Chamber of Commerce fundraiser "A Taste of the Valley" will be held on Thursday, Feb. 27, 2020 at the Holiday Inn from 5:30-8:30 pm.
- The city of Brooklyn is asking for support to allow the city to make its own decisions regarding the use of plastic bags by their vendors.

#### **POLICE DEPT**

- MOTION: Mr. Lasky moved to pay the Sundance invoice in the amount of \$3,360 to cover the annual hosting fee from 12/1/19 11/30/20. Second by Mrs. Presot Motion carried 5-0
- The background checks for the three (3) new hires will be complete at the end of this week.
- Sgt. Jim Cassidy retired effective today, January 7, 2020.

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#### **COMMUNITY SERVICES**

- Project Hope served seventeen (17) families / twenty (20) children over the Christmas holidays.
- Several businesses adopted families or made donations.
- Holiday Art in the Park went well
- The first quarter report to NOACA will be completed next week and should result in either a partial
  or full reimbursement on the grant.
- Mrs. Presot asked what company adopted a family and the response was OHIO DESK.

#### **SERVICE DIRECTOR**

- Mr. Hatgas is out of town tonight.
- Jason Knowles, arborist, has completed the village tree inventory and we will need an ordinance at the next council meeting to pay his invoice of \$5,814 to be reimbursed by the County tree grant.
- We will submit the inventory to the county and begin work on the next round of grant funding for our tree canopy.
- The leaf vac is still out as needed
- There are flag markings on Tuxedo, Wexford and North for work to be done by Columbia Gas in the Parma area.
- They will not be digging in Brooklyn Hts.

# **ENGINEER**

- Mr. Henry submitted the supplemental grant application for the police car on Jan. 3, 2020
   Ordinance 01-2020 is on the agenda tonight which allows us to receive the education for our MS 4 requirements. They provide educational assistance for the conservation of soil and water resources.
- The village will pay \$5,500 and NEORSD will reimburse the \$5,500.

#### **BUILDING INSPECTOR**

- NIDEC has had several inspections
- 613 Tuxedo transferred last month and renovations are in progress

#### **LAW DIRECTOR**

#### **CLERK/ TREASURER**

- Ted Biskind would be happy to present the new healthcare to the employees. Mayor Procuk suggested giving the employees the option of a daytime meeting.
- Closed the year with \$724,100 in the general fund.
- Will be working on the budget with the department heads.
- Met the county deadline for some information yesterday.
- Ended the year about 4% under budget.
- In 2019 we put:
- \$163k into the Capital Improvement Fund
   \$130k into the Retired Accrued Benefit Fund
   \$100k into the Economic Development Fund

Mayor Procuk said we are very lucky to have the staff and employees we have, who continue to care about, not only their jobs and the day to day, but they keep an eye on the budget and are very careful on how our taxpayer dollars are utilized.
