CORRESPONDENCE

- Cuyahoga Soil & Water Conservation District has filed their annual report.
- Letter from the village arborist, Jason Knowles regarding the state of the village public trees and recommendations for funding and planting additional trees in the empty spaces.
- Acknowledged a press release regarding the NIDEC ground breaking ceremony.
- Note from Mike Kepchar informing council that he has had a coyote in his back yard, probably due to their den being disturbed by the construction.
- Note from Holly Zak concerning the condition of the steps in the park that lead from the parking lot up to the pavilion.

AUDIENCE

- Extensive arguments regarding the basketball hoop and signage on the upper park.
- FYI our park is not a private park due to numerous extenuating circumstances but the Park Board originally funded the purchase of equipment for the park.
- Mr. Dowling explained that the signs noting "residents only" or "by permit" would mean to reserve the area for certain times, whether it be basketball or baseball,
- Mayor Procuk said if someone is breaking the law, call the police.
- Ciera Clemons of W. 5th St. said she bought her home here for three reasons; taxes, safety and the school district. She just wants everyone to respect each other.
- If no laws are being broken there will be no arrests.
- Becky Stepka of W. 5th St. asked if the police have to hear the swearing in order to site them.
 Chief Algeri said they must hear it to issue a ticket but most of their calls were warnings. In 72 shifts they received 6 calls. If someone is being disorderly the officer may choose to pursue it further. There are ordinances concerning noise and nuisance.
- Chief Algeri asked that if you are lodging a complaint, please call the dispatch number, (216) 741-2700 so that the calls can be logged. Calling a friend in the concession stand or the park cannot be queried.
- Brian Loebick said they have been discussing the basketball court for 10+ years.

- Unidentified speaker asked about the plans to renovate the park. She asked about having a
 committee to discuss the changes that need to be implemented. She referenced the Park Board
 and that they only meet a few times a year and run their events. She said she wants to know
 what will happen rather fixing a 25-year old piece of equipment. She wants to know what the
 evolution ideas are.
- Mayor Procuk explained that there are two different issues here:
 - 1. The Park Board is run by volunteers who used to raise money through Home Days for different events. Today they raise money by selling the banners on the fences and they have very limited funds. They used to purchase all of the park equipment, sports equipment and uniforms. As the funds dwindled down the village took over. You can join the Park Board through the Men's and Women's Service Clubs. She said she doesn't want to join.
 - 2. The Park, Playground and Community Services Committee is part of the village administration subsidized by village tax dollars. Three council members are on the committee but all council members attend the meetings.
 - 3. The plan for the park is minute. We are applying for grants funding to replace the stairwells, the sprinkler area and the tennis counts.
 - **4.** You can either attend a Park, Playground and Community Services Committee meeting or you can get involved in the Park Board.
- She asked if the Park Board could evolve and become an arm of the committee and work with the village
- Lindy Schuckert said she "was in the WSC and had to quit because she was going nuts. The issue with the MSC and the WSC is "we've already tried that", "we don't want to change". There is a revelation of parents who want to get involved and are tired of paying an arm and a leg to put their kids in outside sports because they are not happy with our rec program. There is a pocket of parents who are passionate and want to do well for the city but we are slapped in the face every time we are told you have to be part of the WSC, you have to be part of the MSC or this is the way we've done it. Every year it's the same people doing the same thing and it's not working, status quo is why the park looks the way it does. Let's get some fresh brains....doesn't mean they will make any decisions because you still need your city leaders making the decisions."
- Unnamed woman said we are a tiny village with a huge park and we are willing to do the leg work
 of looking for funds, ideas, pricing things and there are professional people in the village who are
 willing to help. Unnamed man said there are individuals who are willing to donate money to
 purchase park equipment and that they were ready to mulch the park themselves. He said that
 Robert Crocker was willing to donate \$500 to spruce up the park.
- Patty Tommer suggested selling bricks to raise money. Use the money towards the park.
- Mayor Procuk said he could form an ad hoc committee that will consist of three council members and residents.
- Matt Walsh agrees that there should be an ad hoc committee.
- Shane Casey touted the Park Board 5K on October 5th.

FIRE CHIEF

- Received the State of Ohio EMS grant for equipment in the amount of \$2,841
- Hydrant testing is completed
- Switched to Chagrin Valley Dispatch on June 26th.
- Thanked Mayor Procuk and council for the Arbor Day celebration in memory of Chief Cook.

- Patti Tommer questioned where a 911 call from you cell phone goes. Chief Stefanko said it goes to CCOM first and then to dispatch.
