FIREARMS SAFETY

Each day, 15 children under the age of 19 are killed by gun fire, and many more are injured. Most of these shootings are preventable with just a minimal amount of safety precautions taken by the gun-owner. The loss of a loved one as a result of an accidental shooting is devastating. Firearms safety begins with you the gun owner. If you are not trained in firearm safety, seek training from a qualified instructor before attempting to shoot any firearm.

Here are some suggestions on how to store and transport your firearms.

- Store all of your firearms and ammunition separately from each other
- Use trigger locks or a gun safe to keep your firearms from unauthorized use.
- Keep a list of your firearms serial numbers and description in a safe place that is separate from where you store them
- Before transporting a firearm in a motor vehicle, make sure that it is unloaded.
- Transport the firearm in the trunk of your vehicle or in a lockable case, not in the glove box or under the seat.
- Transport the ammunition in a separate container from your firearm.
- Treat every firearm as if it were loaded.
- Never point a firearm at anything you do not want to shoot.
- Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot.
- Be sure of your target and what is behind your target before you shoot.

Here are some rules you might want to go over with your children.

- If you find a gun
- Stop
- Don't touch
- Leave the area
- Tell an adult.

If you keep firearms at home, explain to children that guns are dangerous and that children should never touch guns except under adult supervision. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!

The Project Hope Food Pantry, located at the Community Services Office, is available per these eligibility requirements: \$23,339 for a one-person household; \$31,459 for a two-person household; \$39,579 for a three-person household. Add \$8,120 for each additional person. The pantry contains poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. If you meet these requirements you can shop our pantry for free groceries, by appointment.

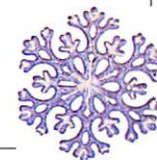

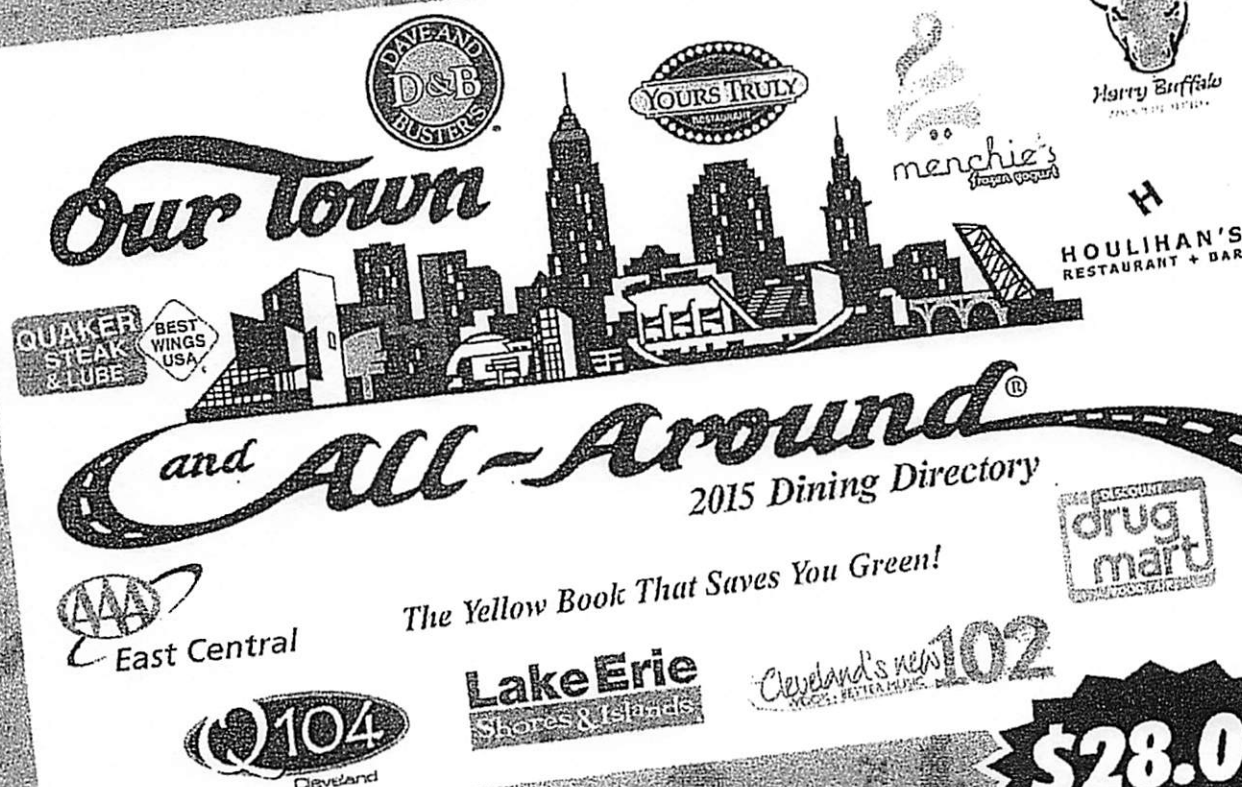

Additional Plastics Now Recycled - In the past only plastic containers labeled #1 (PET) or #2 (HDPE) could be recycled. Kimble is now accepting "rigid" plastic containers labeled #3- #7, in addition to #1's and #2's. Most plastic products are labeled on the bottom with a recycling symbol consisting of arrows that cycle clockwise to form a rounded triangle, and enclosing the number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7. Any rigid food container or other consumer product container labeled in this fashion can now be included for recycling. Examples of plastic containers previously excluded that can now be recycled include salad dressing bottles, peanut butter and jam jars, juice bottles, squeezable bottles (ketchup and mustard), clam shell food containers, microwavable food containers, yogurt containers, margarine tubs, baby milk bottles, shampoo bottles, cooking oil bottles, hand soap bottles, apple sauce cups, cool whip containers, and plastic flower pot containers. Plastic items not acceptable include plastic bags, shrink wrap, Styrofoam, toys, motor oil and antifreeze containers. As you can see, there is a tremendous amount of material which can be diverted from your rubbish cart to your new 65-gallon two wheeled recycling cart. Recycling a ton of plastic saves the energy equivalent of 1,500 gallons of gasoline!

Your collection day remains the same; please remember to set all your residential rubbish and recyclable materials at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.
