BUYING OR SELLING ON LINE? Beware of scams

The internet makes it easier to buy or sell. Unfortunately, it also makes it easier for people to rip you off.

The best thing to do if you get an e-mail from a would-be scammer is to delete it and not respond.

Poor spelling, odd phrasing, and a lack of knowledge about the item you are selling are common signs of mass-produced scam e-mails.

If you're selling: The fake check scam

You list your item for sale. Buyer offers to pay the full asking price & says he'll take care of shipping. The buyer says he has a cashiers check for more than the amount of the purchase price. He wants you to deposit the check & then wire the extra money to him via Western Union or a similar service.

The scammer is hoping you'll wire the cash before you learn the check is a forgery. Some forgeries are surprisingly good & may even use correct bank routing numbers to convince you, & your bank, that the check may be genuine.

If you deposit the check, the bank is required by law to make the money available to you after a certain time period. But that doesn't mean the check is good. It may be weeks or months before the bank determines the check is a fraud. By then, the money you wired to the scammer is long gone.

If you're buying: Fraudulent escrow scams

In this scam, the seller asks for payment to be deposited with an on-line escrow company. Unfortunately, the escrow company is part of the scam. Once money is deposited, often by Western Union or another service at the request of the seller, the seller & the escrow company vanish, leaving the buyer with nothing.

The bottom line: Follow these tips

- If the deal looks too good to be true, it probably isn't true.
- If the buyer appears to know nothing about the item you're selling & asks no questions about it, he's probably not interested in it. Scammers don't want your item. They want your cash.
- Poor spelling & odd phrasing are often signs of an overseas scammer.
- Remember, you can always insist that the final deal be made in person.
- Don't accept a check for more than the selling price. Avoid complicated payment schemes.
- Don't assume just because you have the party's cell phone number that it is legitimate. Lot of these cell phones are pre-paid with stolen credit card numbers. There is no way of tracing it back to the person who committed the scam.
- Most escrow sites on the internet are fraudulent. Use a real & reliable escrow service that <u>you</u> designate. Research a service well before sending any money.
- Research the check with the bank on the check. Don't use the phone number provided on the check. Look it up yourself. They usually can detect fraudulent checks faster than your bank.
- Above all, use common sense. Don't let your desire to make a sale blind you to obvious signs that something is fishy.

Brooklyn Heights Police Special Needs Registry

The Brooklyn Heights Police Special Needs Registry is a voluntary registry of individuals with special needs who may come into contact with the police department. The goal of the program is to give police quick access to information about registered individuals in an emergency situation or in the event they wander away from a safe environment.

Who is considered special needs?

- > Individuals diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder
- ➤ Individuals diagnosed with Dementia or Alzheimer's, who may be prone to wandering away from a safe environment
- > Individuals who have cognitive or mental health impairments

Eligible individuals need only to complete the attached form and return it the Brooklyn Heights Police Department. Forms are available on our website at www.brooklynhts.org, stopping by the police station, or calling our office at 216-741-1327.

Our department's mission is to ensure the safety and well-being of the residents of Brooklyn Heights. The Special Needs Registry is strongly encouraged for all individuals who have special needs should an emergency event arise.







OPERS CHANGES ARE COMING

IMPORTANT INFORMATIONAL SESSION, SEPTEMBER 15TH LUNCH AT NOON, PRESENTATION AT 1:00 P.M. BY KATHLEEN KAPUSTA

If you are a member of the Ohio Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS), you should already know that your current Humana Advantage Plan for medical coverage will be ending on December 31, 2015. Beginning in October, OPERS retirees, age 65 or older, must select an alternate health care plan. To help you do so, OPERS has established a Connector program through One Exchange.

With the assistance of the Connector, you will be able to select a MedSup/drug plan or an Advantage plan offered by Humana and several other companies. You must work with the Connector to receive the OPERS allowance into your Health Retirement Account (HRA). All conversations with the One Exchange Connector will be conducted by phone.

This informational session will be presented by Kathleen Kapusta, the Village Social Worker. The focus will be on Medigap plans, Part D and Advantage plans. It is designed to provide you with background information, so that you will be better prepared for the decision-making process, when you make contact with the OPERS Connector

The session will be held on Tuesday, September 15th at the Community Center. Enjoy lunch and social at Noon and the presentation will begin at 1:00 p.m. Please register by calling the Community Services office at (216) 739-3702.

The Pantry contains poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. If you meet these requirements you can shop our pantry for free groceries. Pantry visits are by appointment only.

 Aerate to introduce oxygen and reduce the incidence of thatch in the lawn. Both mechanical (core) and biological (liquid) methods are effective.

 Lawn seeding can be done until the end of the month. Be sure seed is in direct contact with the soil for best germination.

 If you aren't seeding your lawn this Fall, apply corn gluten meal to thwart Fall weed seeds.

Continue to mow high at 3 or 4 inches.

 Monitor for grubs and animal activity; skunks dig to find grubs.

CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS OHIO

Chapter 1060.01 RUBBISH PICK-UP

- (a) No waste container or waste or refuse not placed in a container shall be placed in front of any house or other building by the owner, agent, lessee or occupant of that building for collection prior to 6:00 p.m. immediately preceding the day for refuse collection.
- (b) No empty waste container shall be permitted to remain in the front of any house or building by the owner, agent, lessee or occupant of that building later than 9:00 p.m. on the day of refuse collection.

 ORDINANCE 39-92 (PASSED 5-5-92)

Chapter 1060.99 PENALTY

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for each offense. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.





Additional Plastics Now Recycled - In the past only plastic containers labeled #1 (PET) or #2 (HDPE) could be recycled. Kimble is now accepting "rigid" plastic containers labeled #3-#7, in addition to #1's and #2's. Most plastic products are labeled on the bottom with a recycling symbol consisting of arrows that cycle clockwise to form a rounded triangle, and enclosing the number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7. Any rigid food container or other consumer product container labeled in this fashion can now be included for recycling. Examples of plastic containers previously excluded that can now be recycled include salad dressing bottles, peanut butter and jam jars, juice bottles, squeezable bottles (ketchup and mustard), clam shell food containers, microwavable food containers, yogurt containers, margarine tubs, baby milk bottles, shampoo bottles, cooking oil bottles, hand soap bottles, apple sauce cups, cool whip containers, and plastic flower pot containers. Plastic items not acceptable include plastic bags, shrink wrap, Styrofoam, toys, motor oil and antifreeze containers. As you can see, there is a tremendous amount of material which can be diverted from your rubbish cart to your new 65-gallon two wheeled recycling cart. Recycling a ton of plastic saves the energy equivalent of 1,500 gallons of gasoline!

SERVICE REMINDERS

Your collection day remains the same; please remember to set all your residential rubbish and recyclable materials at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.




