# How do I obtain an Ohio ID Card for my child?

You may apply for an Ohio ID card for your child at any local deputy registrar location. Check www.bmv.ohio.gov for locations.

# What documentation will I need to provide for an Ohio ID?

You must provide proof of name, date of birth, and Social Security number, if ever assigned. The acceptable documents list can be viewed at our website: www.bmv.ohio.gov/driver-license/pd.htm. Any child under the age of 18 years old must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, who must also provide proof of name, date of birth, Social Security number, if every assigned, or their Ohio driver license or state ID.

# Why should I get my child an Ohio ID card?

Ohio photo ID cards for children will assist authorities in the event that a child is reported missing.

### Where can my child use their Ohio ID card?

Ohio ID cards are used for identification purposes only. This card cannot be used for anything else, including driving privileges.

# How old does my child have to be before they can obtain an Ohio ID?

There is no minimum age for obtaining an Ohio ID card.

# Don't forget to include a listing for your child's Next of Kin in connection with their state ID.

It will help authorities get in touch with the child's parents or guardian. Visit www.bmv.ohio.gov for more information.

Forgetting to turn your clock AHEAD on Sunday, March 8, 2015 could cost you some valuable time; forgetting to change the smoke detector's battery could cost you your life! The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department reminds you to change your smoke detector batteries Sunday, March 8th as you reset your clocks to daylight savings time. The time changes in the fall and spring coincide with recommended battery life in a smoke detector. Smoke detectors are present in 92% of American homes, but nearly onethird don't work because of worn or missing batteries. As part of our ongoing effort to make certain that every village household has a working smoke detector, the fire department will be accepting any resident's request to have their smoke detector batteries replaced. More importantly, if you do not have a working smoke detector, please buy one and we will install it for you. If you would like to participate in this program, please fill out the form below and drop it in the payment box located to the left of the main entrance of our municipal building (345 Tuxedo Ave.). I will personally be in contact with you to schedule a date and time.



# AFFORDABLE CARE ACT By Kathleen Kapusta, LISW-S, MSSA

There still are many questions regarding how the Affordable Care Act (ACA), passed by Congress in 2010. Much confusion exists regarding the impact of the ACA on those who have Medicare. The provisions relating to Medicare are:

- Coverage for annual wellness visits
- Elimination of cost sharing for most preventative services
- Increased consumer protection to Medicare Advantage benefit plans
- Phasing down the Part D coverage gap (aka the "donut hole")

Higher-income Medicare beneficiaries (those earning more than \$85,000 for an individual or \$170,000 for a couple) will pay slightly more for their Part D prescription drug coverage

Just remember Medicare the plan of coverage for Seniors and those on Social Security Disability. This is because the Health Insurance Marketplace is geared to individuals under age 65 and the uninsured. As a Medicare beneficiary, you do not have to sign up for anything with the ACA. In fact, it is against the law for a person to sell a Marketplace plan to someone they know is on Medicare. Since Ohio used the federal exchange for our Health Insurance Marketplace, Medicare Supplement Plans (Medigap) and Medicare Part D plans are not even available through the ACA Marketplace.

The Project Hope Food Pantry, located at the Community Services Office, is available per these eligibility requirements: \$23,339 for a one-person household; \$31,459 for a two-person household; \$39,579 for a three-person household. Add \$8,120 for each additional person. The pantry contains poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. If you meet these requirements you can shop our pantry for free groceries. Call today for an appointment.

- There will be a charge of \$200 per senior household (\$280 after April 30, 2015) for the service.
   Check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The program cost for HEAP recipients is \$80, (\$100 after April 30, 2014).



Sharpen mower blades

Check filters and replace if necessary

Clean spark plugs and replace if necessary

Clean the deck

Set the blades at 3 or 4 inches

# **MOWING MARCH MADNESS**

Get your lawn mower ready for the busy season ahead.

Every 3 years, soil test in spring (or late fall) to determine what nutrients need to be added to the soil. Testing saves money, time and prevents over application of nutrients. Kits can be found at local Soil and Water Conservation District or Cooperative Extension offices.

Lightly rake the lawn to remove compacted grass and snow mold caused by excess moisture.

Start a compost pile with the first grass clippings of the season.
 Subsequent clippings should be left on the lawn as nature's fertilizer.
