

MOTHER EARTH - TREAT MOM RIGHT

- Mow high at 3 or 4 inches and let clippings lie on the lawn. Save money, time, and prevent over application of nutrients by letting the grass clippings add nitrogen to the soil as nature's fertilizer.
- Don't mulch or compost clippings with annual weed seed heads. Instead, bag it up and dispose of in the trash to prevent more weeds being introduced to your lawn.
- Continue to hand pull or spot treat weeds with an organic weed control spray.
- If Japanese beetle grubs are an issue and soil conditions are right, apply Milky Spore to control the population. One application lasts for 10 years.
- Reduce or eliminate pesticides to protect children and animals.

PRE-SALE PASSES FOR NON-RESIDENTS (CUYAHOGA HEIGHTS SCHOOL DISTRICT RESIDENTS) ARE \$50.00 PER PERSON (ALL AGES) AND FAMILY PASSES ARE \$125.00.

THESE PASSES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR PRE-SALE PURCHASE ON MONDAY, APRIL 27, 2015 – THURSDAY, JUNE 4, 2015. AFTER THAT, PASSES WILL BE SOLD AT THE SWIMMING POOL DURING REGULAR WORKING HOURS AT A PRICE OF \$60.00 PER PERSON, AND \$135.00 FOR THE FAMILY PASS.

THIS YEAR, THE VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS IS CONTRIBUTING A PORTION OF THE COST. FOR AN INDIVIDUAL PASS, YOU ARE ONLY RESPONSIBLE FOR \$25.00 PER PERSON AND FAMILY PASSES WILL ONLY COST YOU \$75.00.

These charges will be collected at the time you fill out the pool pass information.

Checks should be made payable directly to Cuyahoga Heights Village.

The following information is requested by Cuyahoga Heights to obtain a pool pass:

All sections of the pass must be filled out including the emergency name and phone numbers for all passes. Height, weight, age, color of hair and eyes, allergies or medical problems must also be listed. All pass holders will be required to have their picture taken at the swimming pool the first time the pass is used.

If the children in the family have a different last name than the parent they must have proof of custody of that child. Cuyahoga Heights has the right to question custody rights of any child and will forfeit the pass of a child who does not legally belong to the parent living in Brooklyn Heights.

Non-resident employees who work for our village are not eligible to buy passes.

PERTINENT INFORMATION THAT WILL BE NEEDED FOR EVERYONE OBTAINING A PASS INCLUDES: NAME, ADDRESS, BIRTHDATE, HEIGHT, WEIGHT, ALLERGIES, EMERGENCY CONTACT #. IT WOULD BE HELPFUL IF YOU HAD THIS INFORMATION WITH YOU AT THE TIME OF FILLING OUT THE PASSES. IN THE PAST, RESIDENTS HAVE MADE LABELS AHEAD OF TIME WITH THE PERTINENT INFORMATION LISTED ABOVE FOR THEIR FAMILY MEMBERS, TO SAVE TIME IN FILLING OUT THE PASSES.

U14 – Ages 12 & 13 (A size 5 ball will be used, 36 feet from goal)



A NOTE FROM SOCIAL WORKER, KATHLEEN KAPUSTA...

SHINGLES VACCINE

The older a person is, the more severe the effects of shingles can be. This vaccine is specifically designed to protect people against shingles and will not protect people against other forms of herpes, such as genital herpes. CDC recommends Zostavax for use in people 60 years old and older to prevent shingles. This is a one-time vaccination. There is no maximum age for getting the shingles vaccine. Individuals may get the shingles vaccine, regardless of whether they recall having had chickenpox or not. Medicare Part D plans cover the shingles vaccine. The amount of cost-sharing (money you have to pay) for vaccinations vary. Medicare Part B does not cover the shingles vaccine. If you have private insurance or Medicaid, your plan may or may not cover the vaccine; contact your insurer to find out. As always you should always speak with your primary physician prior to seeking any such medical treatment.

ASSISTANCE FOR DISABLED AT GAS STATIONS

People with disabilities may find it difficult or impossible to use the controls, hose, or nozzle of a self-serve gas pump. As a result, at stations that offer both self and full service, people with disabilities might have no choice but to purchase the more expensive gas from a full-serve pump. At locations with only self-serve pumps, they might be unable to purchase gas at all.

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires self-serve gas stations to provide equal access to their customers with disabilities.

If necessary to provide access, gas stations must -

- Provide refueling assistance upon the request of an individual with a disability. A service station or convenience store is not required to provide such service at any time that it is operating on a remote control basis with a single employee, but is encouraged to do so, if feasible.
- Let patrons know (e.g., through appropriate signs) that customers with disabilities can obtain refueling assistance by either honking or otherwise signaling an employee.

Provide the refueling assistance without any charge beyond the self-serve price.

BICYCLE SAFETY

1. Protect your head wear a helmet.

6. Act like a car. Drivers are used to the patterns of other drivers. Don't weave in and out of traffic. The more predictably you ride, the safer you are. Check for traffic. Be aware of traffic around you.
7. Don't get distracted. Don't listen to music or talk on the phone while riding.
8. Obey all traffic laws & lights
9. Assure bicycle readiness. Is your bicycle properly adjusted? Is your saddle in a comfortable position?
10. Do a quick bicycle test. Check your brakes and your wheels. Make sure that "quick release" wheels are properly secured.


