

BROOKLYN HEIGHTS POLICE DEPARTMENT PARK SECURITY OFFICERS WANTED

The Brooklyn Heights Police Department is accepting applications for the position of Park Security Officer. Duties of this position include patrolling the Brooklyn Heights Village Park on foot during scheduled shifts and reporting criminal, dangerous or suspicions activity to the sworn officers on duty. A Security Officer may also provide assistance to the police department during special events such as Community Fun Day, Memorial Day Parade, Easter Egg Hunt, and Halloween patrol. Requirements: At least 21 years of age, high school diploma or equivalent, ability to complete further training after hire such as CPR and first aid, and ability to walk Village Park including stairs and hill. Starting pay for the position is \$11.75 per hour with incremental raises each year to top pay of \$15.67 after five years. WHEN YOU ARE WASHING YOUR CAR IN THE DRIVEWAY REMEMBER YOU ARE NOT JUST WASHING YOUR CAR IN THE DRIVEWAY

Whats the problem with car washing? Theres no problem with washing your car. Its just how & where you do it. Allowing car wash waste water to drain into your street where it enters a storm drain can pollute our streams & rivers, ultimately polluting Lake Erie.

- Most of the storm drains in our community empty into Tinkers Creek, through smaller streams & then to Lake Erie.
- The problem starts with the soap even biodegradable soaps can harm creatures living in local waters.
- Car wash waste water also contains the oil, grease, grime, heavy metals & other materials that are rinsed off vehicles. . Substances that are toxic to fish & other aquatic life.

WAYS TO PROTECT OUR STREAMS & LAKE ERIE:

- Wash your car on your lawn & allow the grass & soil to act as a natural filter, capturing the material from your car. Or use an old length of hose to divert the rinse water from your driveway & into the lawn.
- Use soap sparingly. Use a hose nozzle with a trigger to save water.
- Pour your bucket of soapy water down the sink when your done, not in the street.
- Use a commercial car wash that recycles its water or sends its wash water to a sanitary sewer.

CAREGIVERS, NOT CARETAKERS

Perhaps some of you remember that years ago, those who "took care" of others, such as elderly parents, spouses or relatives with a disability, were known as **CARETAKERS.** For several decades now, the politically correct term to describe this same group of individuals is **CAREGIVERS.**

Some may ask, "What's in a name?"...quite a bit. While the word "care" remains in both these titles, it is the second word that is most significant. The selfless, dedicated individuals who give of themselves to provide the highest quality of life for those they care for, truly are givers. They give their time, effort, energy and focus, sometimes to the extent of super human levels.

The consequence of this boundless giving is that sometimes, caregivers lose or forget about themselves in the process. Following are some recommendations for caregivers that hopefully if you are a caregiver or know someone who is, may make a difference.

Get help. You have heard the saying, "No man is an island," well, you are not. Reach out to relatives, your church family, neighbors, and friends. Community services are there for a reason, to serve the community. Find out what is available and utilize these resources; brainstorming with knowledgeable individuals can be invaluable. Knowing what benefits and services your loved one may be entitled to can make the difference between a successful in home arrangement and needing to seek out of home placement. **Remember**, sometimes you must tell family members specifically what help is needed, rather than waiting for their offer to step in!

Take breaks. This means building into your schedule some "me" time. Easier said than done when you are involved in the 24-hour a day job of care giving. But, it is a necessity because to do your best, you need to be your best, which requires taking time for yourself. Identify what is relaxing for you and do it on an as-needed basis. **Remember**, you are not the Eveready Bunny, you do need to recharge your batteries!

Understand you are only human. There will be moments, hours and even days when you question your ability to manage the task before you. If you weren't questioning this, that would be more concerning. Anyone of the caregivers throughout this country or even within your village, know what you are experiencing. If there have not already been, there will be days when you believe that you have taken on more than you can really handle. There will be days when you find yourself getting angry and perhaps short with the person for whom you are caring. Do not be guilty, care giving brings out the best and worst in us. **Remember**, feeling overwhelmed is normal and does not mean you are a bad caregiver!

Cherish the priceless memories. Yes, that is right, as you look back these will be memories that are priceless. With an attitude of gratitude, try to focus on at least one positive thing a day. **Remember**, in the future you will be glad you did.

HERITAGE LOAN PROGRAM

HOW TO QUALIFY FOR A LOAN

Repairing, maintaining or rehabbing an older home can be a challenge. The Heritage Home Program is here to help. The Heritage Home Program loan is a low-interest fixed-rate home equity loan for homeowners to affordably maintain and improve their older houses.

Your home does not need to be historic and does not need to be in an historic district – it only needs to have been built prior to 1965.

- *Is your home located in a participating community? Yes, Brooklyn Heights is a participating community
- *Is your house at least 50 years old? The home must be 50 years or older.
- *is the property zoned residential? The property must be zoned residential.
- *Does the home contain three occupancy units or less? Both owner occupied and non-owner occupied rental properties of 3 units or less qualify for the loan.
- *Has your project already started? Work that has already started cannot be funded with loan proceeds. This includes downpayments and purchase of materials.
- *Is there equity in the home? The loan amount is based on the available equity in your home and tailored to the project scope. The bank will use an after-rehab appraisal and base equity on the projected value of the house after the projects are complete.
- *Are the property taxes current? Property taxes must be up-to-date.
- *Is there more than one existing lien on the property? The Heritage Home Program loan can be a first or second lien (mortgage) on the property, but it cannot be the third.
- *Is homeowners insurance in place for the property? The property must be insured.
- <u>*Does your project qualify?</u> Typical project examples are: roof repair and replacement, painting, insulation, window repair and replacement, basement waterproofing, masonry repair, kitchen and bath renovation, compatible additions, finishing attic and basement, electrical, plumbing and HVAC.

*Your project cannot involve:

- -New or repair of vinyl siding or vinyl windows
- -Luxury items such as hot tubs or swimming pools
- -New decks and patios
- -Incompatible additions

THESE PASSES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR PRE-SALE PURCHASE ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 6, 2016 – THURSDAY, JUNE 2, 2016. AFTER THAT, PASSES WILL BE SOLD AT THE SWIMMING POOL DURING REGULAR WORKING HOURS AT A PRICE OF \$60.00 PER PERSON, AND \$135.00 FOR THE FAMILY PASS.

THIS YEAR, THE VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS IS CONTRIBUTING A PORTION OF THE COST. FOR AN INDIVIDUAL PASS, YOU ARE ONLY RESPONSIBLE FOR \$25.00 PER PERSON AND FAMILY PASSES WILL ONLY COST YOU \$75.00.

These charges will be collected at the time you fill out the pool pass information. Checks should be made payable directly to Cuyahoga Heights Village.

The following information is requested by Cuyahoga Heights to obtain a pool pass:

All sections of the pass must be filled out including the emergency name and phone numbers for all passes. Height, weight, age, color of hair and eyes, allergies or medical problems must also be listed. All pass holders will be required to have their picture taken at the swimming pool the first time the pass is used.

If the children in the family <u>have a different last name than the parent</u> they must have proof of custody of that child. Cuyahoga Heights has the right to question custody rights of any child and will forfeit the pass of a child who does not legally belong to the parent living in Brooklyn Heights.

Non-resident employees who work for our village are not eligible to buy passes.
