WINTER DRIVING TIPS

Winter driving can present troublesome challenges for even the most diligent of drivers. Snow & ice make driving more difficult & sometimes even dangerous. When driving in the snow, do everything slowly & gently. Remember, in the snow, tires just barely grab the road. Accelerate slowly & gently, turn slowly & gently & brake slowly & gently. **Slippery roads** are the biggest hazard of winter driving- caused by ice, slushy snow or rain. Roads are especially slick following the first rain after a dry spell since oil & grease have built up on the roads. Remember the distance it takes to bring your car to a stop on dry pavement. In winter conditions, allow at least 3 times that distance to reach a full stop & avoid skidding. Reduce the danger of skidding by driving more slowly & by pumping the brakes as you slow down for a turn rather than holding them down. Test your brakes frequently & never tailgate. If in spite of your precautions you find yourself beginning to skid, **DO NOT BRAKE**. Instead, take your foot off the accelerator & gently turn your car in the direction you want your front wheels to go. Hitting the brakes or turning sharply will only lock you into a skid. If you can't get control of your car, it is better to steer into a snow bank or fence than to risk a collision in traffic. **Visibility** is another hazard of winter driving. In heavy snow, keep your lights on. If you get stuck in snow, avoid spinning your wheels - you'll only dig in deeper. Instead, shovel snow away from the wheel pads & pour salt, sand around the drive wheels to improve traction. **WINTER CAR KIT** Keep these items in your car: Flashlights with extra batteries, First aid kit with pocket knife, Necessary medications, Several blankets, Matches, Extra set of mittens, socks & a wool cap, extra clothes, Small sack of sand or salt for generating traction under wheels, Small shovel, Booster cables, Set of tire chains or traction mats, Brightly colored cloth to use as a flag, Bottled water.

AARP TAX PREPARATION

Pre-registration is necessary and appointments will be made on a first-come, first-serve basis beginning on January 15th.

SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL



Seniors, age 65+ with no household member under the age of 65, and disabled residents (with proof from a medical doctor) can apply. Cost is \$125 for the season, unless approved for HEAP for the 2015-16 year. HEAP-approved applicants will pay \$50 and the HEAP discount will be applied after your acceptance letter is received by our office. The application and program outline can be found on the village website, and at the Community Services and Municipal offices.

FOOD PANTRY INCOME LEVELS



The Project Hope Food Pantry, located at the Community Services Office, is available per these eligibility incomes: \$23,339 for a one-person household; \$31,459 for a two-person household; \$39,579 for a three-person household. The pantry contains meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. If you meet these requirements you can shop our pantry for free groceries, by appointment.

GO PAPERLESS AND GET YOUR MEDICARE SUMMARY NOTICES ELECTRONICALLY!

Now Medicare recipients can access their Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs) in a new and exciting way — electronic delivery! These are called electronic MSNs (eMSNs). By signing up to get eMSNs, you will:

- Access new eMSNs faster at MyMedicare.gov [Note: eMSNs are monthly and paper MSNs are quarterly]
- Reduce your mail – no more paper copies to file
- Help Medicare save money

HOW TO SIGN-UP

Visit MyMedicare.gov, and select “Create an Account” to register. Once you’ve signed up for your MyMedicare.gov account, complete the following steps:

1. Login to MyMedicare.gov
2. Select “My Account” from the menu
3. In the “User Information” tab, select “Email and Correspondence Settings” (continued on next page...)
4. In the “Electronic Medicare Summary Notices (eMSNs)” area, select “edit.”
5. Select “Yes” and then “Submit” and you’re done!

MEDICARE HOSPICE BENEFIT

ELIGIBILITY

Medicare will provide coverage for your hospice care if you have part A and **meet all of the following:**

- Your hospice doctor and your primary care physician (if you have one) certify that you’re terminally ill (with a life expectancy of six months or less)
- You accept pain and symptom relief (palliative care) instead of care to cure your illness. You sign a statement choosing hospice care instead of other Medicare-covered treatments for your terminal illness and related conditions
- You receive care from a Medicare-certified hospice agency

Once you begin receiving hospice benefits, you must create a plan of care with the hospice medical director and your loved ones or doctor.

COVERED SERVICES

- Skilled nursing
- Durable medical equipment
- Nutrition and dietary counseling
- Skilled therapy
- Prescription drugs for pain management and symptom control
- Medical social services
- Pastoral care
- Aide and homemaker services
- Respite care





COSTS

When you elect the hospice benefit, Original Medicare pays for all care related to your terminal condition, even if you have a Medicare Advantage Plan. Medicare pays in full for all the services described above, with some small exceptions:



- Prescriptions: **Inpatient** pain-management and symptom control drugs are covered in full. For **outpatient** pain-management and symptom-control drugs, you pay no more than \$5 for each prescription filled.
- Respite care: When you need care by someone other than your caregiver so your regular caregiver can rest, you pay 5 percent of the Medicare-approved amount.
