#### **BICYCLE SAFETY**

- 1. Protect your head. Wear a helmet.
- 2. Stay visible. If drivers can see you, they are less likely to hit you. Use lights when biking at night or low light conditions.
- 3. Look, signal & look again. Use hand signals to let drivers and other bicyclists know where you're going. Look and make eye contact. Don't assume drivers will stop.
- 4. Stay alert. Keep a look out for obstacles in your path.
- 5. Go with he flow. Bike in the direction of traffic.
- 6. Act like a car. Drivers are used to the patterns of other drivers. Don't weave in and out of traffic. The more predictably you ride, the safer you are. Check for traffic. Be aware of traffic around you.
- 7. Don't get distracted. Don't listen to music or talk on the phone while riding.
- 8. Obey all traffic laws & lights.
- 9. Assure bicycle readiness. Is your bicycle properly adjusted? Is your saddle in a comfortable position?
- 10. Do a quick bicycle test. Check your brakes and your wheels. Make sure that "quick release" wheels are properly secured.

#### PHONY PUBLISHERS CLEARING HOUSE LETTER

A local senior sent BBB a copy of a phony letter they received from "Publisher's Clearing House" (PCH). The letter was on PCH letterhead stating "CONGRATULATIONS FINAL WINNER."

The letter explained that the consumer won \$5 million dollars. It continued saying, "All participants were selected through a balloting system which has been drawn from ninety thousand stores from Canada and the United States; using your credit card(s) and debit card(s) at various stores, your name is automatically entered. To claim the prize consumers must call their agent to have the funds released. The letter claimed, "All funds must be claimed within 5 business days of receiving this notice; otherwise all funds will be returned as unclaimed and will be donated to charity."

#### BBB and PCH suggest these tips before claiming any prize:

PCH or any other legitimate sweepstakes will **NEVER** ask you to send/wire money or prepaid debit cards to claim a prize, pay taxes, or fees. At PCH no payment is ever necessary.

If you receive an email stating that you have won a major sweepstakes prize, but are asked to provide personal financial information, or send money to claim the prize — **STOP**---you have most likely been contacted by a fraudulent sweepstakes. PCH does not notify major prize winners by email.

If you receive a check claiming to be from a legitimate sweepstakes and are asked to cash it and wire/send a portion back — STOP---you are the victim of a scam. The check is not real! You may be able to cash the check immediately but it can take weeks for the check to bounce. Now you are stuck paying the fees for a faulty check.

#### **PROGRAM COST**

There will be a charge of \$250 per senior household for the service. Check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.

Repairing, maintaining or rehabbing an older home can be a challenge. The Heritage Home Program is here to help. The Heritage Home Program loan is a low-interest fixed-rate home equity loan for homeowners to affordably maintain and improve their older houses.

Your home does not need to be historic and does not need to be in an historic district – it only needs to have been built prior to 1965.

- \*Is your home located in a participating community? Yes, Brooklyn Heights is a participating community
- \*Is your house at least 50 years old? The home must be 50 years or older.
- \*Is the property zoned residential? The property must be zoned residential.
- \*Does the home contain three occupancy units or less? Both owner occupied and non-owner occupied rental properties of 3 units or less qualify for the loan.
- \*Has your project already started? Work that has already started cannot be funded with loan proceeds. This includes downpayments and purchase of materials.
- \*Is there equity in the home? The loan amount is based on the available equity in your home and tailored to the project scope. The bank will use an after-rehab appraisal and base equity on the projected value of the house after the projects are complete.
- \*Are the property taxes current? Property taxes must be up-to-date.
- \*Is there more than one existing lien on the property? The Heritage Home Program loan can be a first or second lien (mortgage) on the property, but it cannot be the third.
- \*Is homeowners insurance in place for the property? The property must be insured.
- <u>\*Does your project qualify?</u> Typical project examples are: roof repair and replacement, painting, insulation, window repair and replacement, basement waterproofing, masonry repair, kitchen and bath renovation, compatible additions, finishing attic and basement, electrical, plumbing and HVAC.

#### HYDRANT FLUSHING



#### VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS MAY 21, 2016 THROUGH JUNE 5, 2016 9:00am to 4:00pm Daily



The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department will be flushing fire hydrants as an on-going program of hydrant and water maintenance. While hydrants are open, the homes on that block may experience discolored water or a drop in water pressure.

#### **REASONS FOR TESTING**

- To alleviate accumulation of mineral deposits within the water mains, thus reducing the incidence of discolored water.
- Preventative maintenance to make sure each hydrant is in top operating condition.

#### PRECAUTIONS TO TAKE

- Turn off any devices that automatically bring water into your home during flushing hours. Examples:
   Automatic ice makers, automatic yard sprinkling systems, etc.
- Avoid, if possible, running water. Examples: Doing laundry, Running bathwater, etc.

#### WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE DISCOLORED WATER

- 1. Wait one (1) hour after you are sure hydrant flushing is completed for the day.
- 2. DO NOT USE HOT WATER.
- 3. Run <u>COLD</u> water from whatever faucet is closest to wherever the water supply enters your house (typically in the basement) for approximately fifteen (15) minutes. It should clear up.
- If problem continues, contact the Cleveland Water Department at: During Normal Business Hours M-F 8:00am-4:30pm (216) 664-3160 All Other Times (216) 664-3060

#### WHEN WILL MY STREET BE FLUSHED?

- Signs are posted on the fire hydrants near the ends of the street one (1) day prior to flushing. For Example:
   Sign posted Tuesday afternoon indicates Wednesday flushing. Signs are removed after the street has been flushed.
- A daily listing of streets to be flushed can be found on the Brooklyn Heights Fire Department website at www.brooklynhts.org
- Any questions please call the BHFD @ 351-3542

The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department's primary responsibility is to emergency responses. Therefore, it is possible a street may not be flushed on its assigned day. Likewise, hydrant flushing will not take place if it is raining. In these instances, the signs will remain posted until flushing is completed.
