By certified mail: Send your full name, complete address, Social Security number, date of birth & \$5 fee (not cash) to Equifax Security Freeze, P.O. Box 105788, Atlanta 30348. Online: <https://www.freeze.equifax.com> By phone: 1-800-685-1111. (You'll hear a long message that you can't interrupt, then hit 8 at the first number prompt.)

TransUnion

By certified mail: Send your full name, current proof of address, date of birth & Social Security number & proof of current residence (like a copy of your driver's license) and \$5 fee (not cash) to TransUnion Fraud Victim Assistance, P.O. Box 6790, Fullerton, CA 92834. Online: transunion.com. (There's no charge for now to order a freeze online, but please note that you're being routed to a TransUnion marketing affiliate to get the freeze. TransUnion says it reserves the right to add the \$5 fee at any time.) By Phone: 1-888-909-8872.

WHAT HOSPITALS MUST NOW TELL MEDICARE PATIENTS

A new disclosure law is to be initiated by Medicare. The Notice of Observation Treatment and Implication for Care Eligibility (NOTICE) Act was passed by Congress last year and signed by President Obama. It could potentially result in 1.4 million notices a year, to Medicare patients. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has delayed implementation of the NOTICE Act until final approval by the Office of Management and Budget, likely to be late fall 2016.

NOTICE requires hospitals to provide detailed oral and written notification in "plain language" to any patient who receives outpatient observation services for more than 24 hours. Know that a patient can be classified as outpatient care **even if their care includes one or more overnight stays in a hospital room**. The notice must be provided within 36 hours of the time the patient begins receiving such services, or upon discharge, whichever occurs sooner.

Why is this important information for Medicare recipients to know? First, since observation status is classified as outpatient care, Medicare pays at a different rate than for inpatient care. Inpatient care is covered by Medicare Part A, while outpatient care falls under Medicare Part B. Next, if a person enters a skilled nursing facility from a hospital and they qualify for Medicare coverage, one of the requirements is that they stay for a minimum of 3 consecutive inpatient nights in the hospital. To qualify for this coverage the hospital stay must be INPATIENT. This is critical information to ask if you or a loved one, covered by Medicare is hospitalized.

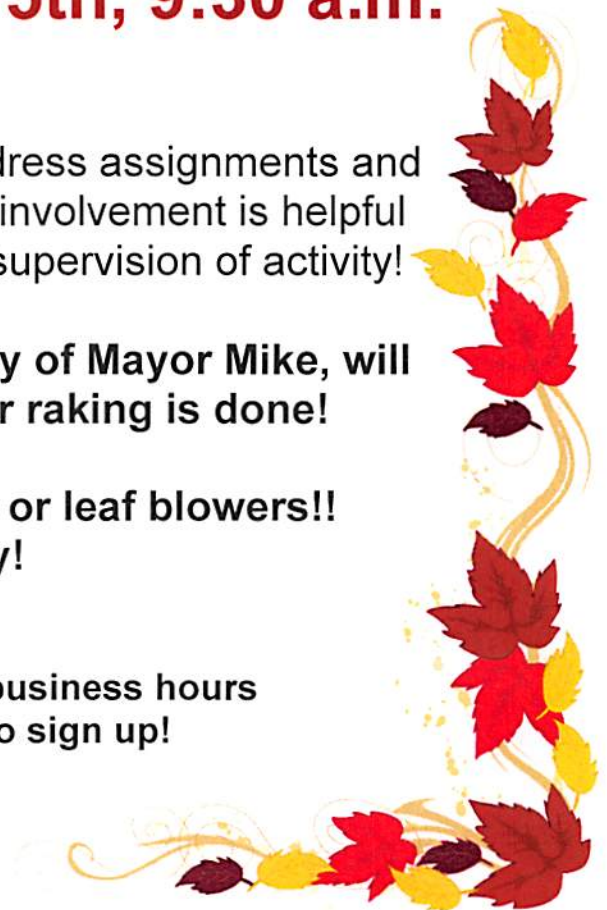

2016 – 17 Senior Snow Removal Program **OUTLINE**

ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

COST

- There will be a charge of **\$125 per senior household, for the service.** A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2016-17 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$50. The discount will be applied once your HEAP acceptance letter is received.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.
- This is a basic snow plowing service. In severe weather conditions, plowing may be delayed.

OUTLINE

- Your street address must be visible from the street.
- If a car is in your driveway while plowing occurs, this will limit the area which will be plowed.
- The driveways are plowed in an assigned order. If the house around the corner is plowed before yours, please be sure that your street will be done in a timely manner. If you have a corner lot, your drive will be plowed by the truck handling your street address.
- If your sidewalk or the street is plowed by the Village after the subcontractor has plowed your drive, we cannot get back out and re-do all of the drives.
- If your drive has been cleared by someone else before the contractor has been there, the contractor will skip your house as it "appears to have been cleared".
- If your drive is missed or there are any problems, please call the Community Service office - on the day of the occurrence. All calls should be made to 739-3702. Messages will be returned as soon as possible. Please do not call the sub-contractor or the Service Department.
- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems, etc. must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 15, 2017. No reports will be honored after this date.

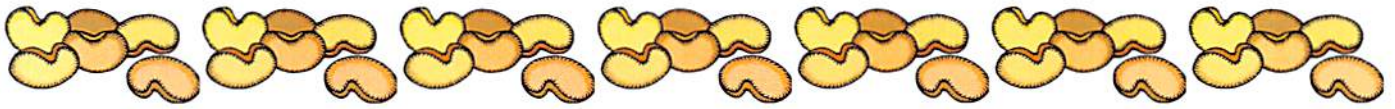

Forgetting to turn your clock **BACK** on Sunday, November 6, 2016 could cost you some valuable time; forgetting to change the smoke detector's battery could cost you your life! The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department reminds you to change your smoke detector batteries as you reset your clocks from daylight savings time. The time changes in the fall and spring coincide with recommended battery life in a smoke detector. Smoke detectors are present in 92% of American homes, but nearly one-third don't work because of worn or missing batteries. As part of our ongoing effort to make certain that every village household has a working smoke detector, the fire department will accept any resident's request to have their smoke detector batteries replaced. **More importantly, if you do not have a working smoke detector or if it is ten years old or older, please buy one and we will install it for you.** If you would like to participate in this program, please fill out the form below and drop it in the payment box located to the left of the main entrance of our municipal building (345 Tuxedo Ave.). The voter registration deadline is October 11th. Voters who have moved or changed their name since they last voted need to complete and return a new Voter Registration Card on, or before this deadline.

Early voting at the Board of Elections begins on October 12th. Early voting dates and hours are available on the Board of Elections website.
