KEEP SAFE IN A FOG

Fog can form in the hills & valleys of some areas. Fog often forms in the morning, although it can occur at any time of day especially with the wild fluctuations of temperature we tend to have here. Driving in fog does represent some challenges. Fog causes hundreds if not thousands of accidents each year. If you find yourself driving in fog, here are a few quick tips to get you through safely:

- Slow down, but don't jam on the brakes. This could cause a pileup behind you.
- Gently pump the brakes until you have slowed to a point where you can see what is in front of you. Pumping the brakes will also serve as a warning for others behind you that you are slowing down.
- Turn on your windshield wipers and defogger as well. In fog, your windshield needs to as clear as possible.
- Keep a clear distance from the vehicle in front of you, but stay close enough so you can see their taillights if at all possible.
- There is a tendency for drivers to tailgate in a thick fog because they don't want to lose sight of the vehicle ahead. That's how pileups happen. Make sure you maintain your distance.
- Use your low-beam headlights especially at night. Your high beams will bounce right back off the fog blinding you. Fog lights, believe it or not, may also do the same thing - especially if not properly installed.
- Always signal your intention for a lane change well before you make a move. The driver coming up behind you might not realize you're there until it's too late.
- If you possibly can, plan to leave the road until the fog subsides. Make sure you pull completely off the road (if it's a highway) and into either a rest area or a side road. Keep your safety blinkers on and pull as far to the right as possible.

MEDICARE PART D PRESENTATION

On Tuesday, September 6th, at 12:30 p.m., at the Senior Social at the Community Center, there will

be a presentation on Medicare Part D. This is the prescription drug program for Medicare participants. If you are on a private drug prescription program it is recommended that you review your drug plan annually. This presentation is not for individuals on an employer sponsored plan or for those wishing to remain with their Medicare Advantage plan. Medicare has an open enrollment from October 15th thru December 7th. To learn more about this program, and what you need to do, come to the presentation by Kathleen Kapusta, Village Social Worker. GET YOUR FLU SHOT OCTOBER 6TH

We will be running a flu shot clinic at the Community Center on Thursday, October 6th at 10:00 a.m. Walgreens will be Get a Flu Shot! administering the immunizations and they accept Medicare and most insurance

company plans. There will be no cost if you have the Medicare B coverage. If you are paying cash, the cost is \$31.99 and you must have exact cash, they cannot make change! You must pre-register by calling 739-3702. Please note this is an adult vaccine only. Bring your insurance card with you!

AARP SMART DRIVER COURSE SEPTEMBER 13TH

We are hosting an AARP Smart Driver course designed especially for drivers age 50+. The course covers defensive driving techniques and the normal changes in vision, hearing, and reaction time associated with aging as well as practical techniques for adjusting to these changes, and current rules of the road to ensure safe driving. There are NO TESTS! Course participants may be eligible to receive a state-mandated, multi-year discount on their auto insurance premiums. Participants should contact their insurance company or agent for more details. The cost of the course is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for nonmembers. Although the course is geared for drivers over 50, anyone can participate. The course will be held at our village community center on Tuesday, September 13th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Call (216) 739-3702 by Friday, September 9th to register.

FOOD PANTRY - NEWLY UPDATED INCOME LEVELS

The Project Hope Food Pantry, located at the Community Services Office, is available per these eligibility requirements: \$23,759 for a one-person household; \$32,039 for a two-person household; \$40,319 for a three-person household. The Pantry contains poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. If you meet these requirements you can shop our pantry for free groceries. Pantry visits are by appointment only.

Medicare Coverage for Diabetics

What supplies are covered under Medicare Part B?

Blood sugar (glucose) test strips

Blood sugar testing monitors

Lancet devices and lancets

Glucose control solutions

Therapeutic shoes or inserts

What is the National Mail-Order Program for diabetes testing supplies?

No matter where you live, you'll need to use a Medicare national mail-order contract supplier for Medicare to pay for diabetes testing supplies that are delivered to your home. If you don't want diabetes testing supplies delivered to your home, you can go to any local store (local pharmacy or storefront supplier) that's enrolled with Medicare and buy them there.

Does the National Mail-Order Program require me to change my testing monitor?

No. If you're happy with your current monitor, look for a mail-order contract supplier or local store that can provide the supplies you need for your monitor. However, if you switch suppliers, you might need to arrange to have your current prescription transferred or get a new prescription for testing supplies from your doctor. Plan ahead before you run out of supplies.

How much will I pay if I buy supplies at a store?

You'll pay the same amount for diabetes testing supplies whether you buy them at the store or have them delivered. National mail-order contract suppliers and local stores can't charge you more than any unmet Part B <u>deductible</u> and 20% <u>coinsurance</u>. Local stores that don't accept assignment may charge you more. If you get your supplies from a local store, check with the store to find out what your payment will be.

How can I find a contract supplier?

To find a list of national mail-order contract suppliers: 1) Visit Medicare.gov/supplier; 2) Enter the ZIP Code and click "Go"; 3) Select "Mail-Order Diabetic Supplies" in the Competitive Bid Categories section. Click the green "Search" button at the bottom of the page. You can also get a list of national mail-order contract suppliers by calling 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227). TTY users should call 1-877-486-2048.

The November 8, 2016 Presidential General Election

On November 8th voters will elect the next President of the United States. There also candidates for the US and Ohio Senate, US Congress and State House Representatives. This Presidential Election also features County Council candidates, judicial seats, the Ohio Supreme Court, and State School Board members. There are also important issues on the ballot.

All Ohio registered voters will be mailed a Vote by Mail ballot application from the Ohio Secretary of State. But voters do not have to wait for this mailing. Vote by Mail ballot applications are available at the Board of Elections website: www.443VOTE.com, by calling the Board of Elections at 216-443-VOTE (8683), and at all public libraries.

The voter registration deadline is October 11th. Voters who have moved or changed their name since they last voted need to complete and return a new Voter Registration Card on, or before this deadline.

Early voting at the Board of Elections begins on October 12th. Early voting dates and hours are available on the Board of Elections website.

Be Wise and Don't Fertilize our Great Lake



Local waterways are impacted when fertilizer is applied incorrectly.

If you fertilize your lawn, practice the 4 Rs of Fertilization:

- **1. RIGHT TYPE.** Have your soil tested to determine fertilizer needs and choose a slow-release fertilizer. Recommended practice: Use phosphate-free organic fertilizer.
- 2. RIGHT RATE. Soil test results will supply you with the appropriate fertilizer rate. Do not exceed the recommended rate and never apply more than 1.5 pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. Recommended practice: Use mulching blades on your mower and leave the grass clippings on the lawn.
- RIGHT TIME. September is the best time to fertilize lawns when cool season grasses are
 actively growing. Recommended practice: Never apply fertilizer when rain and wind are in the
 forecast.
- 4. RIGHT PLACE. Proper fertilization techniques save money and protect waterways and wildlife. Avoid fertilizing near streams, ditches, hard surfaces, and slopes. Recommended practice: Incorporate native plantings near streams, ditches, and slopes to better intercept pollutants before they enter waterways.


