BICYCLE SAFETY

- Protect your head, wear a helmet
- Stay visible. If drivers can see you, they are less likely to hit you. Use lights when biking at night or low light conditions.
- Look, signal and look again. Use hand signals to let drivers and other bicyclists know where
 you're going. Look and make eye contact. Don't assume drivers will stop.
- Stay alert. Keep a look out for obstacles in your path.
- Go with the flow. Bike in the direction of traffic.
- Act like a car. Drivers are used to the patterns of other drivers. Don't weave in and out of traffic.
 The more predictably you ride, the safer you are. Check for traffic. Be aware of traffic around you.
- Don't get distracted. Don't listen to music or talk on the phone while riding.
- Obey all traffic laws and lights.
- Assure bicycle readiness. Is your bicycle properly adjusted? Is your saddle in a comfortable position?
- Do a quick bicycle test. Check your brakes and your wheels. Make sure that "quick release" wheels are properly secured.

What Is Creditable Coverage?

In the health insurance world, *creditable coverage* is insurance <u>coverage</u> you had in the past that you get *credit* for when applying for new health insurance.

Why would you need credit for prior insurance coverage? In some cases, your new insurer can penalize you for not having had similar coverage in the past. However, if you had similar creditable coverage in the recent past, you'll get credit for that coverage and won't be penalized.

This is why when you receive a *certificate of creditable coverage* from your insurer, it is a very valuable document which should be retained.

One situation where creditable coverage comes into play relates to Medicare Part D. If you don't sign up for Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage when you're first eligible for it, usually when you turn 65 years old, you'll be <u>penalized</u> by paying higher monthly premiums if you later decide to buy Medicare Part D coverage.

This rule is in place to prevent people from gaming the system. Without this rule, you could forgo Part D coverage to save on monthly <u>premiums</u> when you have low drug costs, but sign up for Part D coverage when your monthly drugs are more expensive than the monthly insurance costs would be. <u>Medicare</u> prevents this gaming of the system by requiring those who do not sign up for Medicare Part D on time, to later pay a financial penalty in the form of higher monthly premiums. For every month you go without coverage, your Medicare Part D premium will be 1% higher. If you sign up 25 months late, your premiums will be 25% higher for as long as you have Medicare Part D.

However, it's not really fair to penalize you with higher premiums if the reason you didn't buy Medicare Part D coverage when you first became eligible was because you already had similar prescription drug coverage through your job, union, spouse, or a retiree plan. In this case, you weren't trying to game the system; you were trying to avoid paying twice for the same coverage.

Enter the concept of creditable coverage. If you're able to show you had other coverage providing the similar benefits, you'll be given credit for that coverage and you'll pay the normal premium, not the penalty premium.

Prescription drug coverage that counts as creditable coverage for Medicare Part D must meet both of the following criteria:

- Prescription drug coverage you had continuously without a break in coverage of 63 days or more since you were first eligible to enroll in Medicare Part D.
- The actuarial value of the insurance is equal to or greater than the <u>actuarial value</u> of a standard Medicare Part D plan.

How do you know if your current prescription drug coverage will count as creditable coverage for Medicare Part D? Your current insurer should tell you. Insurers are supposed to send a notice of creditable coverage to all of their enrollees who are eligible for Medicare Part D coverage. This notice should come before your initial Medicare part D eligibility period and before each subsequent open enrollment period.
