(a) No minor under the below indicated years of age shall loiter, idle, wander, stroll, play or be present in or upon public grounds, public places, public buildings, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other lots or parcels of land that are not such minor's place of residence, or other unsupervised places within the Municipality between the hours indicated below:

- (1) 12 years of age and under - 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. of the following day.
- (2) 13 and 14 years of age - 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. of the following day.
- (3) 15 and 16 years of age - 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. of the following day.
- (4) 17 years of age - 12:00 midnight to 6:00 a.m.

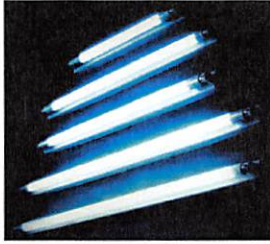

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RECYCLING UPDATES

Please be advised of the following changes to the Household Hazardous Waste Program that will be effective June 2, 2017. We are implementing these changes to reduce program costs for items where alternative disposal options exist.

Fluorescent Bulbs

We will no longer be accepting fluorescent bulbs in our program. Residents can dispose their compact fluorescent (CFL) bulbs for free at any Home Depot and Lowes Home Improvement store. Because of this existing program, we decided not to duplicate a service that is being offered at no cost to taxpayers.

Rechargeable Batteries

There is a free, nationwide program to recycle rechargeable batteries through **Call2Recycle**. We ask that you instruct your residents to take their rechargeable batteries to one of the Call2Recycle drop-off locations. These include all Best Buy, Home Depot, Lowe's Home Improvement, and Radio Shack stores in Cuyahoga County. To find a location near you, call 1.877.2.RECYCLE or search with your zip code at www.Call2Recycle.org. Your city can also become a Call2Recycle location and host a drop-box for residents. Visit www.call2recycle.org/start-collecting/

Single-use alkaline batteries can also be recycled through some local Call2Recycle drop boxes. If you choose not use a Call2Recycle drop box, **alkaline batteries can be safely disposed of with normal household waste**. 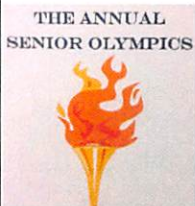

Insurance Inventory

While most of us realize how important insurance is, in our daily lives, we rarely spend the time to evaluate our insurance needs. Here are some recommended steps to conduct an insurance inventory.

Homeowners/Renters Insurance

Conduct a home inventory and make sure your homeowners or renters policy is up-to-date. Take photos or video of your possessions. Remember to note prized items and their value so you can discuss proper coverage. You can utilize various apps to simplify the process. Or you can download a paper inventory checklist at: www.insurance.ohio.gov.

Auto Insurance

Review your liability insurance to make sure you have adequate coverage for any potential suits. Assess your deductibles for comprehensive and collision coverage. You'll pay those amounts if your car is damaged or totaled without fault of another driver. Adjustments can affect your premium. Keep a copy of your insurance card and your agent and/or insurer's contact information in your vehicle.

Health Insurance

Make sure you have your current insurance card. Verify that your paperwork is in order before seeing a doctor. If your insurance has a specified network, check that you doctors are still covered by your policy. In-network and out-of-network providers can change annually. Know your co-pays to avoid surprises. Before traveling, check to identify urgent care centers and hospitals that accept your insurance coverage. Understand any applicable co-pays and deductibles your plan might have.

Life Insurance

Life changes should trigger a life insurance review. Any significant life changes may warrant a modification in your life insurance. It could change things such as coverage limits, premiums and beneficiaries. You may want to learn about options such as conversion privileges and use of death benefit, prior to death. Conducting such an insurance inventory may be valuable from a financial perspective, as you may be able to adjust costs or do some competitive shopping. Additionally, it can be very important from a coverage perspective. It is important to know what you have, what you need and to coordinate the two in the area of insurance coverage. Being an informed consumer can make all the difference.

When shopping for insurance be cautious not to become a victim of fraud. Do not give out personal information such as your Social Security Number or Bank Account data, until you have verified the legitimacy of the insurer and the agent. 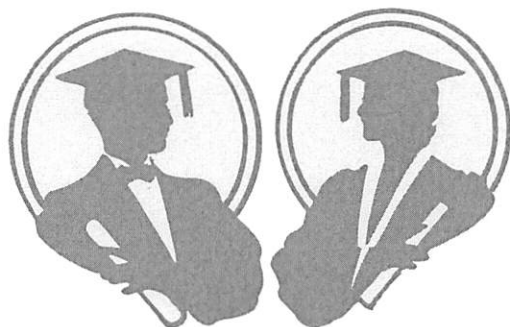

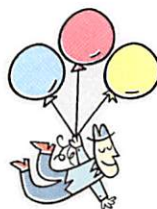

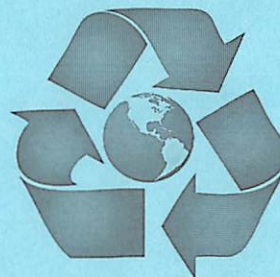
