OHIO'S NEW TEXTING LAW

Under age 18, it's illegal to use any mobile communications device while driving in Ohio, effective August 31, 2012.

- This means no texting, e-mailing, cell phone, video games, iPad/tablet or handheld GPS use while driving, even when sitting at a light or in a traffic jam.
 - A primary offense the only reason police need to pull you over.
 - First violation: \$150 fine and driver license suspended for 60 days.
 - Second violation: \$300 fine and license suspended for one year.
- Exceptions: Pre programmed GPS or emergency calls to police, ambulance, fire dept., etc.
 Adult Drivers Face a \$150 fine for texting or reading/sending e-mail.

LOOK OUT FOR SCAMS!

Scammers use a variety of tactics to make their offers seem legitimate. Their initial contact may occur by telephone, mail, door-to-door solicitations, fliers, e-mails, or phony websites. They often try to convince consumers to send them money or give personal information, such as bank account numbers and Social Security numbers. Be aware of the common signs of a scam.

SIGNS OF A SCAM

1) You're asked to wire money to a stranger. 2) You've won a contest you've never heard of or entered. 3) You're pressured to "act now!" 4) You have to pay a fee to receive your "prize" 5) Your personal information is requested. 6) a large down payment is requested. 7) A company refuses to provide written information. 8) A company has no physical address, only a P.O. Medicare Part D Presentation by Village Social Worker

On Tuesday, August 21st there will be an important presentation on Medicare Part D at the Community Center. This is the Prescription Drug Program for Medicare participants.



Do you want to save money on prescription drugs?

If you are on a private drug prescription program it is recommended that you review your drug plan annually. There can be annual change in the factors that impact cost:

- **Premiums**
- Deductibles
- Co-Payments
- **Formularies**

Medicare has an open enrollment from October 15th thru December 7th. To learn more, and what you need to do, come to the presentation! With the ever-rising cost of prescriptions, this can be a very valuable program. If you will be new to Medicare, this program is important to you also! Not reviewing your drug program annually could be costing you money!! (The presentation is not for individuals on an employer-sponsored plan or for those wishing to remain with a Medicare Advantage plan.)

VILLAGE FOOD PANTRY OPEN TO ALL


QUALIFYING RESIDENTS

The Village Food Pantry is available for all eligible households. Annual income eligibility requirements are \$24,279 for a one-person household; \$32,919 for a two-

person household; \$41,569 for a three-person household. Add \$8,640 for each additional household member. The Pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. Availability of items varies. Pantry visits are by appointment only during normal business hours. Shut-in residents may call and request delivery.

MEDICARE PART D - COMPLETE THE SHEET

Medicare Part D, remember D for Drugs, is the Prescription Coverage portion of Medicare; which began in 2006. It is not something you receive automatically, you must apply for Part D coverage. Just as important, you need to review your Part D coverage on a **YEARLY** basis. Why? Because there may have been changes in your medications, the formularies of what drugs the company may cover and the related costs.

Also, remember when judging what Prescription Coverage plan is appropriate for you, all costs must be considered. This includes costs for the deductible, premium and drugs.

The following form needs to be completed fully so your information can be processed through the Medicare.gov website.

Each year, between October 15th and December 7th, there is open enrollment for Medicare Part D. What does this mean to you?

- Complete the Sheet, which is information needed to review the available Part D plans for you personally.
- Only list prescribed medication, do not include vitamins and other over the counter meds you may be using.
- If a medication is prescribed as PRN, estimate the general frequency of your use, on the form.
- Make sure to use your current Medicare number, the most recent one you received.
- List the phone number that it is easiest to reach you at, so you can get your information once completed.
- Note an email address you can access, either at your home or that of a family member/friend.
- Turn this form in to Community Services as soon as possible.
- Forms will be evaluated in the program on the Medicare.gov website, in the order received.
- You will be contacted and advised of your options.
- If you have not been contacted with your results by December 4th, please notify Community Services.

The Medicare open enrollment period is October 15 through December 7. Permits are Required:

Even small jobs require a permit. This includes, but is not limited to: roof replacement, installation of a swimming pool, placement and construction of storage sheds, decks, and replacement of hot water tanks, furnaces, AC units, windows, or siding. The Village Building Inspector will conduct an inspection to ensure proper installation and compliance with state and/or local codes. Please contact the Building Department for regulations and procedures prior to beginning any work. A reminder that all contractors working in the village must be registered with the building department.

Upkeep of your Property:

Ordinances require that all premises and exterior property be maintained. This includes but is not limited to: grass, shrubs, fences, and accessory buildings.
