#### 618.07 BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS

No person shall own, harbor or keep in custody a dog which disturbs the peace by barking, yelping, howling or making other loud noises to the annoyance and/or discomfort of any person. Continuous barking, yelping, howling and and/or making other loud noises for 15 consecutive minutes by such dog, whether confined inside a residence or building or to the outside area, shall be deemed to have disturbed the peace and to have caused the annoyance and discomfort of persons: provided, that at the time of the complaint, no person or persons were trespassing or threating to trespass upon the private property of the owner, and provided that the dog was not being teased. or provoked in any manner.

#### VILLAGE FOOD PANTRY OPEN TO ALL QUALIFYING RESIDENTS

The Food Pantry, located in the Community Services Office is available for all eligible households. Annual income eligibility requirements are as dictated by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services which are \$24,119 for a one-person household; \$32,479 for a two-person household; \$40,839 for a three-person

household. Add \$8,360 for each additional household member. The Pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. Availability of items varies. Pantry visits are by appointment only during normal business hours. Shut-in residents may call and request delivery.

#### MEALS ON WHEELS

The lunch time meal, is delivered daily, Monday through Friday, by our team of Community Services drivers. Meals can be dietary specific and the program is very affordable. The cost of each meal is only \$3.25. If you show proof of current participation in the HEAP

program, your cost will be \$1.45. Residents can sign up at any time and delivery will begin the following Monday. You qualify to receive these meals if one of the following applies to you:

- Due to a low income, it is difficult to purchase food
- Unable to prepare meals for yourself
- Recovering from surgery or illness and need temporary help
- Disabled or homebound

#### PATIENT CRITERIA FOR MEDICARE COVERAGE OF SKILLED NURSING FACILITY (SNF) STAYS

Medicare will cover inpatient skilled care only if all the following criteria are met:

- Must have Medicare Part A (hospital insurance) and unused days in this benefit period.
- A qualifying hospital stay. This means an inpatient hospital stay of three consecutive days or more, starting with the day admitted to the hospital as an inpatient, but not including any outpatient or observation days or the day of hospital discharge.
- Entering the skilled nursing facility within 30 days of hospital discharge.
- The doctor must order skilled nursing care, which requires the skills of professionals, such as registered nurses, physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech-language pathologists or audiologists.
- Skilled care, on a daily basis, that can only be provided in an inpatient SNF.
- Skilled services are needed for the medical condition that was treated during the qualifying three-day hospital stay or a related condition.
- Prescribed skilled services must be reasonable and necessary for the diagnosis or treatment of the eligible condition.

If you meet all above requirements, Medicare coverage depends on how long you stay in the SNF. Additional coverage may be offered by your Medigap or Medicare Advantage plans.

How Medicare covers SNF stays:

Days 1 through 20:

Medicare pays the full cost for each benefit period

Days 21 through 100: Medicare pays all but a daily coinsurance of \$167.50 per day (2018)

After 100 days:

Medicare provides no coverage

#### **PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY**

You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65,

<u>or</u>

 You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your inability to perform this task must be submitted with your application.

#### **PROGRAM COST**

- There will be a charge of \$250 per senior household for the service. Check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or <u>exact cash</u> will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the federal HEAP program.

be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The program cost for HEAP recipients is \$100.

#### **PROGRAM INCLUDES**

- The cutting of your lawn, driveway and sidewalk edged and grass around trees trimmed.
- The driveways and walkways cleared of grass clippings. The grass clippings from your lawn will be collected on an "as needed" basis in spring and fall.
- <u>We CANNOT give special accommodations</u>. If you desire special accommodations, please utilize this service as a supplement to privately arranged services.

#### **IMPORTANT**

- There will be no refunds after May 1, 2018.
- Your lawn is one of many being serviced. Please be patient!
- The contractor designates the height of the mower blade it WILL NOT be adjusted.
- Your lawn will not necessarily be cut on the same day each week.
- Use of a small mower is at the discretion of the contractor ONLY.
- All dog droppings must be picked up! Any yard with dog droppings, WILL NOT be cut.
- Your yard may not be cut if you have a vehicle blocking the entry to the back yard, laundry on a clothesline, obstacles on or hanging over the lawn, including large hedges and bushes.

#### THE MAY 8, 2018 PRIMARY ELECTION

There are many important decisions for voters on the May 8th Primary Election Ballot. These include candidates for Governor, statewide offices, US Senate, US Congress, State House and Senate. The County Executive and some members of County Council as well as judicial candidates will also be on the ballot.

This Partisan Primary Election is an opportunity for Democratic, Republican and Green party voters to select the candidates who will advance to the November General Election. However all voters including nonpartisans will have an opportunity to decide State, County, school and municipal issues.

The May 8th Primary also offers people the opportunity to establish their party affiliation, change their party, or become nonpartisan voters. In Ohio the type of ballot voters choose determines their party affiliation.

People who wish to cast ballots by mail need to obtain, complete, and return their Vote by Mail applications as soon as possible. To request an application visit: <a href="www.443vote.com">www.443vote.com</a>, or call 216-443-VOTE (8683). Vote by Mail ballot applications are also available at all public libraries.

Early voting is available from April 10th through May 7th at the Board of Elections located at 2925 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland.

Voter Registration Deadline: You may now register to vote online at www.443vote.com.

THESE PASSES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR PRE-SALE PURCHASE ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 4, 2018 – WEDNESDAY, MAY 30, 2018. AFTER THAT, PASSES WILL BE SOLD AT THE SWIMMING POOL DURING REGULAR WORKING HOURS AT A PRICE OF \$60.00 PER PERSON, AND \$135.00 FOR THE FAMILY PASS.

THIS YEAR, THE VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS IS CONTRIBUTING A PORTION OF THE COST. FOR AN INDIVIDUAL PASS, YOU ARE ONLY RESPONSIBLE FOR \$25.00 PER PERSON AND FAMILY PASSES WILL ONLY COST YOU \$75.00.

If the children in the family <u>have a different last name than the parent</u> they must have proof of custody of that child. Cuyahoga Heights has the right to question custody rights of any child and will forfeit the pass of a child who does not legally belong to the parent living in Brooklyn Heights.

Non-resident employees who work for our village are not eligible to buy passes.
