ANIMALS, LEASH REQUIRED

No dog or cat shall be permitted on a public highway, sidewalk, or any other public place within the Village except when held securely on leash by the owner thereof or other responsible person. No person being the owner or in charge or control of any such animal shall permit said animal to run at large within the limits of this village. Unauthorized entry by said animal upon any premises or upon any public street or ground shall constitute at large within the meaning of this section. Which totally prohibits animals in the Village Park.

618.07 BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS

No person shall own, harbor or keep in custody a dog which disturbs the peace by barking, yelping, howling or making other loud noises to the annoyance and/or discomfort of any person. Continuous barking, yelping, howling and and/or making other loud noises for 15 consecutive minutes by such dog, whether confined inside a residence or building or to the outside area, shall be deemed to have disturbed the peace and to have caused the annoyance and discomfort of persons: provided, that at the time of the complaint, no person or persons were trespassing or threating to trespass upon the private property of the owner, and provided that the dog was not being teased or provoked in any manner.

BICYCLE SAFETY

- 1. Protect your head wear a helmet.
- 2. Stay visible if drivers can see you, they are less likely to hit you. Use lights when biking at night or low light conditions.
- 3. Look, signal & look again. Use had signals to let drivers and other bicyclists know where you're going. Look and make eye contact. Don't assume drivers will stop.
- 4. Stay alert. Keep a look out for obstacles in your path.
- 5. Go with the flow. Bike in the direction of traffic.
- 6. Act like a car. Drivers are used to the patterns of other drivers. Don't weave in and out of traffic. The more predictably you ride, the safer you are. Check for traffic. Be aware of traffic around you.
- 7. Don't get distracted. Don't listen to music or talk on the phone while riding.
- 8. Obey all traffic laws & lights.
- 9. Assure bicycle readiness. Is your bicycle properly adjusted? Is your saddle in a comfortable position?
- 10. Do a quick bicycle test. Check your brakes and your wheels. Make sure that "quick release" wheels are properly secured.

Beware of Scammers Pretending to be Social Security

In the digital age, frauds and scams are an unfortunate part of doing business online. Social Security has seen a spike in phishing scams, and they want to protect you.

Always be cautious to avoid providing sensitive information such as your Social Security Number (SSN) or bank account information to unknown individuals over the phone or internet. If you receive a call and aren't expecting one, you must be extra careful. You can always get the caller's information, hang up, and — if you do need more clarification — contact the official phone number of the business or agency that the caller claims to represent. Never reveal personal data to a stranger who called you.

Please take note; there's a scam going around right now. You might receive a call from someone claiming to be from Social Security or another agency. Calls can even display the 1-800-772-1213, Social Security's national customer service number, as the incoming number on your caller ID. In some cases, the caller states that Social Security does not have all of your personal information, such as your Social Security number (SSN), on file. Other callers claim Social Security needs additional information so the agency can increase your benefit payment, or that Social Security will terminate your benefits if they do not confirm your information. These calls are not from Social Security.

Callers sometimes state that your Social Security number is at risk of being deactivated or deleted. The caller then asks you to provide a phone number to resolve the issue. People should be aware the scheme's details may vary; however, you should avoid engaging with the caller or calling the number provided, as the caller might attempt to acquire personal information.

Social Security employees occasionally contact people by telephone for customer-service purposes. In only a few special situations, such as when you have business pending with them, a Social Security employee may request the person confirm personal information over the phone.

Social Security employees will never threaten you or promise a Social Security benefit approval or increase in exchange for information. In those cases, the call is fraudulent, and you should just hang up. If you receive these calls, please report the information to the Office of the Inspector General at 1-800-269-0271 or online at https://oig.ssa.gov/report.

Remember, only call official phone numbers and use secured websites of the agencies and businesses you know are correct. Protecting your information is an important part of Social Security's mission to secure today and tomorrow.

Medicare Quiz

Medicare is the source of health care insurance for millions of Americans. Yet, there is often confusion regarding this program and the benefits it provides. So, test your knowledge regarding this important program.

Questions:

- If I am in a Medicare Advantage Plan, I no longer have traditional Medicare?
- If I am in Observation Status in a hospital, I remain in the ER or the Outpatient Area?
- If I do not have alternative coverage and do not enroll in a Medicare Part D plan when I am eligible, I will have an annual penalty?
- If I have a Medicare Part D Drug Plan, I can review or change it every year?
- You are eligible to begin Medicare at any age, as long as you are retired?

Answers:

- True Even though you have a Medicare card, you no longer have traditional Medicare. You have chosen to take a Medicare alternative plan.
- False You can be in Observation Status and be on an inpatient floor of a hospital.
- True The penalty is 1%/month higher premium, for every month you were eligible for Medicare and did not have creditable drug coverage.
- True During Open Enrollment, from Oct. 15 through Dec. 7.
- False Medicare eligibility begins at age 65, or after two years, for those on Social Security Disability.

HYDRANT FLUSHING



VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS
JUNE 1, 2019 THROUGH JUNE 15, 2019
9:00am to 4:00pm Daily



The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department will be flushing fire hydrants as an on-going program of hydrant and water maintenance. While hydrants are open, the homes on that block may experience discolored water or a drop in water pressure.

REASONS FOR TESTING

- To alleviate accumulation of mineral deposits within the water mains, thus reducing the incidence of discolored water.
- Preventative maintenance to make sure each hydrant is in top operating condition.

PRECAUTIONS TO TAKE

- Turn off any devices that automatically bring water into your home during flushing hours. Examples:
 Automatic ice makers, automatic vard sprinkling systems, etc.
- Avoid, if possible, running water. Examples: Doing laundry, Running bathwater, etc.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU HAVE DISCOLORED WATER

- 1. Wait one (1) hour after you are sure hydrant flushing is completed for the day.
- 2. DO NOT USE HOT WATER.
- 3. Run <u>COLD</u> water from whatever faucet is closest to wherever the water supply enters your house (typically in the basement) for approximately fifteen (15) minutes. It should clear up.
- If problem continues, contact the Cleveland Water Department at: During Normal Business Hours M-F 8:00am-4:30pm (216) 664-3160 All Other Times (216) 664-3060

WHEN WILL MY STREET BE FLUSHED?

- Signs are posted on the fire hydrants near the ends of the street one (1) day prior to flushing. For Example:
 Sign posted Tuesday afternoon indicates Wednesday flushing. Signs are removed after the street has been flushed.
- A daily listing of streets to be flushed can be found on the Brooklyn Heights Fire Department website at www.brooklynhts.org
- Any questions please call the BHFD @ 351-3542

The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department's primary responsibility is to emergency responses. Therefore, it is possible a street may not be flushed on its assigned day. Likewise, hydrant flushing will not take place if it is raining. In these instances, the signs will remain posted until flushing is completed.
