Crooks love the holidays as much as everyone else, but chiefly because it's an opportune time for crime. Homes jam-packed with glittering gifts. Stores, malls & downtown streets teaming with unsuspecting shoppers. People rushing around, stressed out & careless, looking for last minute gifts, trying to get everything done. It's enough to make a crook giddy with holiday joy.

Here are some tips on how to celebrate safety this holiday season:

IF YOU'RE TRAVELING

Get an automatic timer for your lights. Ask a neighbor to watch your home, shovel snow & park in the driveway from time to time. Don't forget to have mail & newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.

IF YOU'RE OUT FOR THE EVENING

Turn on lights & a radio or TV so it looks like someone is home. Be cautious about locking doors & windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes. Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL

Seniors, age 65+ and, disabled residents (with proof from a medical doctor) can apply. Cost is \$150 for the season, unless approved for HEAP for the 2019-20 year.

HEAP-approved applicants will pay \$60. The HEAP discount will be applied after your acceptance letter is received by our office. The application and outline is attached. Applications can be dropped off the at the Community Services office.



HEAP ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Applications are available for the State of Ohio HEAP Energy Assistance program which provides a one-time benefit to your main

heating source. It also qualifies you for a discount on village senior snow removal and grass cutting programs. You must apply every year and applications are available in our office. Income eligibility levels are: 1-person, \$24,979; 2-person, \$33,819; 3-person, \$42,659.

CHRISTMAS HOPE TREE

Each year we place a tree at the Municipal Center decorated with wishes from children of disadvantaged families in the village. Residents can



take a tag, purchase the requested gift and place it back under the tree. Project Hope will deliver the gifts to the families in time for Christmas. The Hope Tree will be at the Municipal Center (upstairs) November 5th and the deadline for gifts to be returned is December 5th. See the attached flyer for more details.

REMEMBRANCE CELEBRATION

November is National Diabetes Awareness Month

There isn't a cure yet for diabetes, but a healthy lifestyle can *really* reduce its impact on your life. What you do every day makes the difference: eating a healthy diet, being physically active, taking medicines if prescribed, and keeping health care appointments to stay on track. More than 30 million people in the United States have diabetes, but 1 out of 4 of them don't know they have it. There are three main types of diabetes: type 1, type 2, and gestational diabetes, diabetes while pregnant. Type 2 diabetes risk factors include:

- Having prediabetes (blood sugar levels that are higher than normal but not high enough to be diagnosed as diabetes).
- Being overweight
- Being 45 years or older
- Having a parent, brother, or sister with type 2 diabetes
- Being physically active less than 3 times a week
- · Ever having gestational diabetes or giving birth to a baby who weighed more than 9 pounds

You've Been Diagnosed with Diabetes. Now What? It's a balancing act—but you can do it. Meeting with a diabetes educator is a great way to get support and guidance. Speak with your physician regarding a referral to a diabetic educator. You will learn about how to:

- Follow a healthy eating plan
- Get physically active
- Test your blood sugar
- Give yourself insulin by syringe, pen, or pump, if needed
- · Monitor your feet, skin and eyes to catch problems early
- · Get diabetes supplies and store them according to package directions
- Manage stress and deal with daily diabetes care
- Medicare Covered Supplies & Services

To find a contract supplier, call 1-800-MEDICARE (800-633-4227) or visit www.medicare.gov/supplier. Alternatively, Medicare will still cover your diabetes testing supplies if you buy them at a local Medicare-enrolled pharmacy or other store. But it is always best to verify Medicare coverage before you buy. ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

COST

- There will be a charge of \$150 per senior household, for the service. A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted (we do not have the ability to give change).
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2019-20 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$60. The discount will be applied once your HEAP acceptance letter is received.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.
- This is a basic snow plowing service. In severe weather conditions, plowing may be delayed.

OUTLINE

- Your street address must be visible from the street.
- If a car is in your driveway while plowing occurs, this will limit the area which will be plowed.
- The driveways are plowed in an assigned order. If the house around the corner is plowed before yours, please be sure that your street will be done in a timely manner. If you have a corner lot, your drive will be plowed by the truck handling your street address.
- If your sidewalk or the street is plowed by the Village after the subcontractor has plowed your drive, we cannot get back out and re-do all of the drives.
- If your drive has been cleared by someone else before the contractor has been there, the contractor will skip your house as it "appears to have been cleared".
- If your drive is missed or there are any problems, please call the Community Service office on the day of the occurrence. All calls should be made to 739-3702. Messages will be returned as soon as possible. Please do not call the sub-contractor or the Service Department.
- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems, etc. must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 15, 2020. No reports will be honored after this date.




