

WEST NILE VIRUS FACTS AND TIPS

- The West Nile Virus is spread from an infected mosquito that bites a non-infected bird. The bird, now infected, is bitten by another mosquito that absorbs the virus and spreads it to its next bite victim.
- It takes 5 to 10 days for the mosquito to breed in stagnant water.. Any puddle that lasts more than four days is a potential breeding site.

PERCAUTIONS TO HEIP STOP THE WEST NILE VIRUS

- Eliminate standing water in containers such as old tires, tarps (where water collects in the folds). Childers's toys, tire ruts, wading pools, birdbaths, buckets, or any water holding containers.
- Fill in or drain any low places (puddles, ruts) in yard.
- Cover trash containers to keep out rainwater.
- Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets.
- Fill tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water with sand or concrete.
- Change water in birdbaths and plant pots or drip trays at least once each week.
- Keep grass cut short & shrubbery trimmed adult mosquitoes will not hide there.
- Clean roof gutters and downspout screens regularly.
- Store pet food and water bowls indoors when not in use.
- Wear light-colored, long sleeved clothing and long pants if you must be outside.





SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL

Seniors, age 65+ and, disabled residents (with proof from a medical doctor) can apply for the senior snow removal program. The cost remains the same this year at \$150 for the season, unless approved for HEAP for the 2019-20 year. HEAP-approved applicants will pay \$60. The HEAP discount will be applied after your acceptance letter is received by our office. The application and outline are attached. Let's get an early start to sign up! VILLAGE FOOD PANTRY!

The Village Food Pantry is available for all eligible households. Annual income eligibility is \$24,979 for a one-person household; \$33,819 for a two-person household; \$42,659 for a three person household; Add \$8,840 for each additional household member. The pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy

items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. Availability of items varies. Pantry visits are by appointment only during normal business hours. Shut-in residents may call and request delivery.

TIPS ON HIRING IN-HOME CARE

Most Seniors wish to live out their lives in their own homes. At times, the best way to do so, is with the assistance of home care aides. Fortunately, there are a significant number of agencies which provide this assistance. Unfortunately, they are not all equal in the service they provide. Therefore, one must follow the approach of buyer beware. It is critically important that due diligence be used in selecting a home health care agency, to provide in-home care.

When you, or your loved one, need home-health services, consider the following tips:

- Ask for the payment structure in writing, including whether payment is made to the agency or to the care-provider. Note, you may be responsible for paying Social Security, IRS withholding taxes and insurance if you pay the individual directly.
- Inquire into pricing and payment options, such as minimum number of hours and any rate reductions based upon required hours.
- Request verification that the worker is either covered by Workers Compensation or is self-insured.
- If you have any requirements, such as a non-smoking care provider, discuss these in advance.
- Confirm the agency is licensed to specifically perform the services you request, such as medication management. The workers should be properly trained for the services provided.
- Confirm that a background check has been done on the care-provider.
- Ask for references.
- Request to see a copy of the license or certification of any care-provider coming into the home.
- Determine if the agency bonds and insures the care-provider. Check if your homeowner's insurance will cover any loss that may occur, while a care-provider is working in your home.
- Ask if it is possible to meet the care-provider prior to engaging them. Having he appropriate match of personalities is critical as well.



ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

COST

- There will be a charge of \$150 per senior household, for the service. A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted (we do not have the ability to give change).
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2019-20 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$60. The discount will be applied once your HEAP acceptance letter is received.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.

- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems, etc. must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 15, 2020. No reports will be honored after this date.
