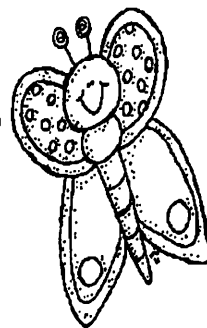

VILLAGE SENIOR LAWN CUTTING PROGRAM

The program serves seniors age 65+ and disabled residents, who have no able-bodied household member to perform the task. If you need assistance, but are under age 65, you may be eligible - please submit an application with the noted documentation attached. The cost for the service is \$275 unless you are a HEAP recipient. See the attached application and program outline.

Senior Citizen Resources invites all adults, age 55+, to compete (including seated events for anyone in a wheelchair or cannot stand too long). Most events will be held at Estabrook on Fulton Avenue. Last year 11 seniors participated, brought home 26 medals and had a lot of fun! Community Services will offer transportation to some or all of the events. The events will run May 13th - May 17th. The sign up sheets are attached - please return them to our office by May 1st. We will register everyone together!

VILLAGE FOOD PANTRY OPEN TO ALL QUALIFYING RESIDENTS

The Food Pantry, located in the Community Services Office is available for all eligible households. Annual income eligibility requirements are as dictated by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services which are \$24,279 for a one-person household; \$32,919 for a two-person household; \$41,559 for a three-person household. Add \$8,640 for each additional household member. The Pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. Availability of items varies. Pantry visits are by appointment during normal business hours. Shut-in residents may call and request delivery.



TRASH TO CURBSIDE UPDATE

MEALS ON WHEELS

The lunch time meal, is delivered daily, Monday through Friday, by our team of Community Services drivers. Meals can be dietary specific and the program is very affordable. The cost of each meal is only \$5. If you show proof of current participation in the HEAP program, your cost will be \$3. Residents can sign up at any time and delivery will begin the following Monday. You qualify to receive these meals if one of the following applies to you:

- Due to a low income, it is difficult to purchase food
- Unable to prepare meals for yourself
- Recovering from surgery or illness and need temporary help
- Disabled or homebound

MEDICARE FRAUD

If you suspect fraud, first address any issues with your provider. While Medicare Fraud is not a common occurrence, it does happen. There are steps you can take to help stop fraud.

RECORD

- Record doctor's appointments and medical tests/procedures on a calendar. Note tests and services, and save receipts and statements from your providers.

REVIEW

- Look for signs of fraud, including claims you don't recognize on your "Medicare Summary Notices" (MSNs), and advertisements or phone calls from companies offering free items or services to people with Medicare. If you have Original Medicare, you'll get a "Medicare Summary Notice" (MSN) in the mail every 3 months that lists all the services billed to Medicare.
- Compare the dates and services on your calendar with your MSNs to make sure you got each service listed and that all the details are correct. If you find items listed in your claims that you don't have a record of, it's possible that you or Medicare may have been billed for services or items you didn't get.
- Visit MyMedicare.gov or call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) to review your Medicare claims. TTY users can call 1-877-486-2048. If you're in a Medicare Advantage Plan (like an HMO or PPO) or Medicare Prescription Drug Plan, call your plan for more information about a claim.

REPORT

- Report suspected Medicare fraud by calling 1-800-MEDICARE. When using the automated phone system, have your Medicare card with you and clearly speak or enter your Medicare number and letter(s).
- You can also report fraud to the Office of the Inspector General by visiting forms.oig.hhs.gov or by calling 1-800-HHS-TIPS (1-800-447-8477). TTY users can call 1-800-377-4950.
- If you identify errors or suspect fraud, call Ohio Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Hotline, provided by ProSeniors, Inc., at 1-800-488-6070.

REMEMBER







- Protect your Medicare Number. Don't give it out, except to your doctor or other health care provider.
- Never give your Medicare Number in exchange for a special offer.
- Never let someone use your Medicare card, and never use another person's card.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65,

or

- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your inability to perform this task must be submitted with your application.

PROGRAM COST

- There will be a charge of **\$275** per senior household for the service. Check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The program cost for HEAP recipients is **\$110**.

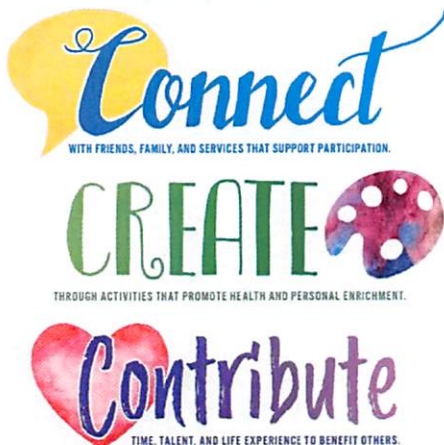

PROGRAM INCLUDES

- The cutting of your lawn, driveway and sidewalk edged and grass around trees trimmed.
- The driveways and walkways cleared of grass clippings. The grass clippings from your lawn will be collected on an "as needed" basis in spring and fall.
- **We CANNOT give special accommodations.** If you desire special accommodations, please utilize this service as a **SUPPLEMENT** to privately arranged services.

IMPORTANT

- There will be no refunds after May 1, 2019.
- Your lawn is one of many being serviced. Please be patient!
- The contractor designates the height of the mower blade - it **WILL NOT** be adjusted.
- Your lawn will not necessarily be cut on the same day each week .
- Use of a small mower is at the discretion of the contractor **ONLY**.
- All dog droppings must be picked up! Any yard with dog droppings, **WILL NOT** be cut.
- Your yard may not be cut if you have a vehicle blocking the entry to the back yard, laundry on a clothesline, obstacles on or hanging over the lawn, including large hedges and bushes.

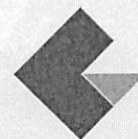

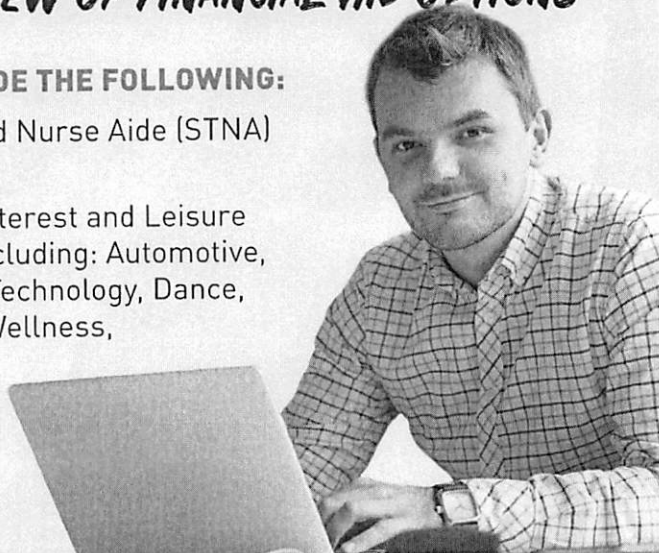

**The Ohio Elks Association, through its lodges across the State,
host action filled soccer shoot competitions for kids up
through U14 (age as of January 1, 2019)**

The Elks Soccer Shoot program consists of two different contests that test different level skills at different ages. A "Five Goal Contest" consists of a series of five goals, decreasing in size from 48 inches to 17 inches. The age groups that use these goals are known as "U-8" which contains all ages seven years old and younger. The contest is open to boys and girls who shoot separately. The U-8 contestants kick from 15 feet from the face of the goal.

The Grid Goal Contest consists of a full-size goal sectioned off so points can be scored when the ball is kicked into certain sections. All ages older than U8 kick at this goal. Kids ages 8-9 kick from 18 feet. Kids 10-11 kick from 27 feet and the 12-13 year old kids kick from 36 feet away. The contest is open to both boys and girls and they shoot separately.
