BUYING OR SELLING ONLINE? BEWARE OF SCAMS

The internet makes it easier to buy or sell. Unfortunately, it also makes it easier for people to rip you off. The best thing to do if you get an e-mail from a would-be scammer is to delete it, not respond. Poor spelling, odd phrasing, & lack of knowledge about the item you are selling are common signs of mass-produced scam e-mails.

If you're selling: The Fake check scam

You list your item for sale. Buyer offers to pay the full asking price & says he'll take care of shipping. The buyer says he has a cashiers check for more than the amount of the purchase price. He wants you to deposit the check & then wire the extra money to him via Western Union or a similar service. The scammer is hoping you'll wire the cash before you learn the check is a forgery. Some forgeries are surprisingly good & may even use correct bank routing numbers to convince you, & your bank, that the check may be genuine. If you deposit the check, the bank is required by law to make the money available to you after a certain time period. But that doesn't mean the check is good. It may be weeks or months before the bank determines the check is a fraud. By then, the money you wired to the scammer is long gone.

The bottom line: Follow these tips

- If the deal looks too good to be true, it probably isn't true
- If the buyer appears to know nothing about the item you're selling & asks no questions about it, he's probably not interested in it. Scammers don't want your item. They want your cash.
 - Poor spelling & odd phrasing are often signs of an overseas scammer.
 - Remember, you can always insist that the final deal be made in person.
- Don't accept a check for more than the selling price. Avoid complicated payment schemes.
- Don't assume just because you have the party's cell phone number that it is legitimate. A lot of these cell phones are pre-paid with stolen credit card numbers. There is no way of tracing it back to the person who committed the scam.
- Most escrow sites on the internet are fraudulent. Use a real & reliable escrow service that you designate. Research a service well before sending any money.
- Research the check with the bank on the check. Don't use the phone number provided on the check. Look it up yourself. They usually can detect fraudulent checks faster than your bank.
- Above all, use common sense. Don't let your desire to make a sale blind you to obvious signs that something is fishy.

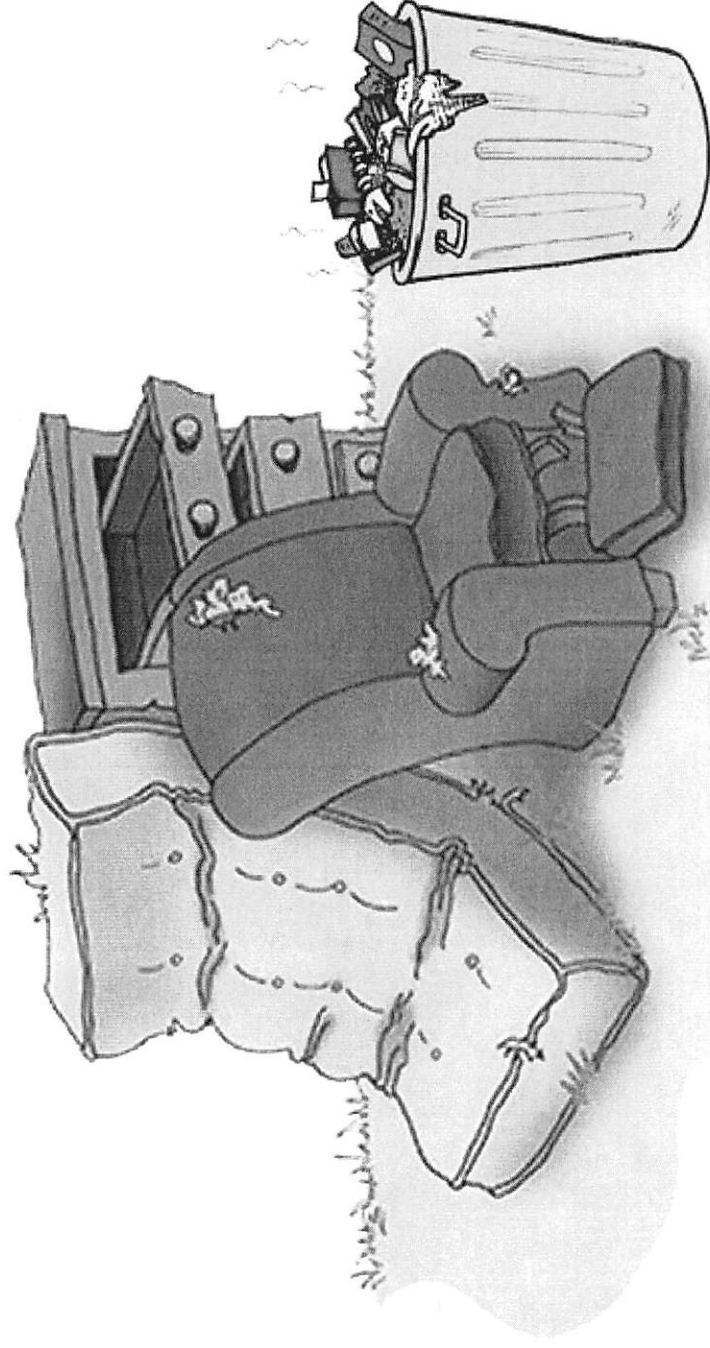

Medicare Part D Presentation by Village Social Worker

On Wednesday, September 4th there will be an important presentation on Medicare Part D at the Community Center. This is the Prescription Drug Program for Medicare participants.



Do you want to save money on prescription drugs?

If you are on a private drug prescription program it is recommended that you review your drug plan annually. There can be annual change in the factors that impact cost:

- Premiums
- Deductibles
- Co-Payments
- Formularies

Medicare has an open enrollment from October 15th thru December 7th. To learn more, and what you need to do, come to the presentation! With the ever-rising cost of prescriptions, this can be a very valuable program. If you will be new to Medicare, this program is important to you also! Not reviewing your drug program annually could be costing you money!! (The presentation is not for individuals on an employer-sponsored plan or for those wishing to remain with a Medicare Advantage plan.)

VILLAGE FOOD PANTRY OPEN TO ALL QUALIFYING RESIDENTS



The Village Food Pantry is available for all eligible households. Annual income eligibility requirements are \$24,979 for a one-person household; \$33,819 for a two-person household; \$42,659 for a three-person household. Add \$8,840 for each additional household member. The Pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. Availability of items varies. Pantry visits are by appointment only during normal business hours. Shut-in residents may call and request delivery.

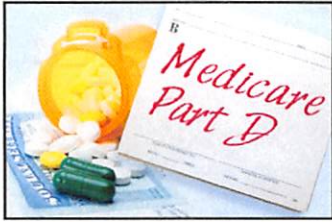
MEDICARE PART D - COMPLETE THE SHEET

Medicare Part D, remember D for Drugs, is the Prescription Coverage portion of Medicare; which began in 2006. It is not something you receive automatically you must apply for Part D coverage. Just as important, you need to review your Part D coverage on a **YEARLY** basis. Why? Because there may have been changes in your medications, the formularies of what drugs the company may cover and the related costs. This refers not only to the company you are with, but also to other companies that may have available a better, more cost effective, drug plan than the one in which you are currently enrolled.

Also, remember when judging what Prescription Coverage plan is appropriate for you, all costs must be considered. This includes costs for the deductible, premium and drugs.

The attached form needs to be completed fully so your information can be processed through the Medicare.gov website. Each year, between October 15th and December 7th, there is open enrollment for Medicare Part D. What does this mean to you?

- Complete the Sheet, which is information needed to review the available Part D plans for you personally
- Only list prescribed medication, do not include vitamins and other over the counter meds you may be using
- If a medication is prescribed as PRN, estimate the general frequency of your use, on the form
- Make sure to use your current Medicare number, the most recent one you received
- List the phone number that it is easiest to reach you at, so you can get your information once completed
- Note an email address you can access, either at your home or that of a family member/friend
- Turn this form in to Community Services as soon as possible
- Forms will be evaluated in the program on the Medicare.gov website, in the order received
- You will be contacted and advised of your options
- If you have not been contacted with your results by December 4th, please call (216) 739-3702.



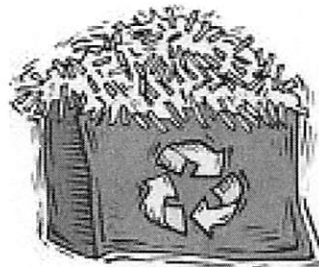

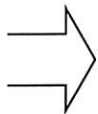
VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS IS SPONSORING A FREE PAPER SHREDDING DAY

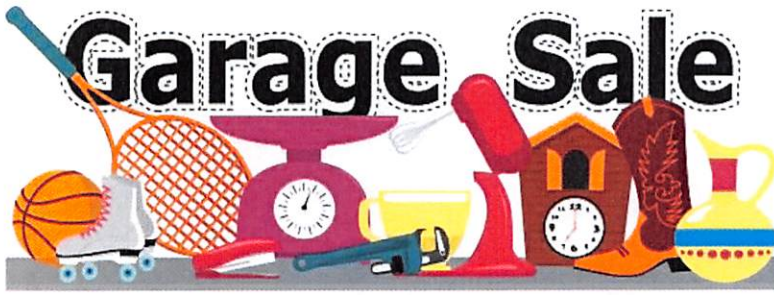

660.035 DUMPING.

(a) No person shall cast away or dump any refuse, dirt, stones, rubbish, papers, wood, bottles, tin cans, grass clippings, leaves or other articles of a similar nature upon any public lands, or upon any street or highway, or upon any property within the Village belonging to another person.

This subsection shall not apply to any person dumping upon land set aside or authorized to be used as a public dump, nor to land the owner of which has secured from the Village a permit authorizing such owner to fill in such land, provided that the person so dumping has secured permission from such owner and complies with the provisions of said permit.

(Adopting Ordinance)

(b) No person shall dump, throw or knowingly cause to be dumped or thrown upon any street, highway or public place in the Village any tacks, bottles, wire, glass, paper and paper containers, nails, ashes, rubbish, garbage or any other article, thing or substance which is or may prove unsightly or a nuisance or danger to the public or the abutting property, except such articles or substances as may be placed on a street, highway or public place with the consent of the public authorities, or for rubbish or garbage collection purposes, or for the maintenance, repair or construction of the public streets or places. (Ord. 43-76. Passed 5-18-76.)

(c) No person shall dump, or suffer or permit to be dumped, ashes, rubbish or any other waste material upon any land within the Village, nor shall any person dump, or suffer or permit any one to dump, any dead animal, garbage or any substance that is by its dead composition detrimental to health.

(Ord. 60-76. Passed 9-7-76.)

(d) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be subject to the penalty provided in Section [698.02](#).
