

DRIVING IN THE RAIN POSES NEW CHALLENGES FOR INEXPERIENCED DRIVERS

Driving in the rain poses a whole new set of challenges, especially if you're not an experienced driver. Those challenges are even worse when you consider the pounding that the roads have taken this winter. Here are some quick tips for driving in rainy weather.

- When it starts to rain, slow down by taking your foot off of the accelerator. Never quickly brake because it may cause the car to skid.
- Wait a few seconds to use your wipers. If you use your wipers immediately, the dirt and grime on your windshield may smear & obstruct your vision.
- Turn on your low beams. When your windshield wipers come on you should have your low beams on.
- If you use the two-second rule to maintain a safe distance from the car in front of you, make it four when it rains.
- Be watchful of pedestrians. It's harder to see them when it rains.
- If you're on the freeway, turn off the cruise control. If your car begins to hydroplane, the cruise control may actually accelerate causing you to lose control of the vehicle.
- Never cross moving water. As the saying goes, "turn around, don't drown".
- Even if you have a SUV with massive tires, never try to run through standing water at the bottom of a bridge underpass. Water splashing up into your car can cause damage to your vehicle's electrical components. And if you get stuck, it's likely that even more water will accumulate under the bridge.
- Be careful the first 10 minutes of any rain storm. This is when oil & grime on the road mix with water to make driving conditions especially hazardous.
- Be sure to check your tire tread in the spring. Winter causes a lot of wear, and a pair of bald tires can be a real hazard in wet weather.



PROGRAM COST

- There will be a charge of \$200 per senior household, per year for the service. Check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The program cost for HEAP recipients is \$80.

CONTROLLING MOSQUITOES IN YOUR YARD & NEIGHBORHOOD

Mosquitoes can breed in many places around your yard including areas of standing water, unused tires, kiddie pools, and clogged gutters. Eliminating standing water will help to reduce the population of biting adult mosquitoes and allow you to better enjoy the outdoors this summer.

- Clean your gutters often to keep them flowing.
- Remove or properly store children's toys that can collect water.
- Place the lids on your garbage cans to keep rain out.
- Maintain your ornamental pond or bird bath.
- Cover your rain barrel openings with screening.
- Store wheel barrows upside down or on end.
- Fill in low spots in your yard.
- Maintain your pool and keep stagnant water off the cover when not in use.
- Remove containers that may hold water (buckets, tires, etc.) from behind garages or sheds.
- Clean out any roadside or drainage ditches so that water can flow properly.

Following these tips will help prevent mosquitoes from living in your yard and also reduce the chances of your family becoming infected with a mosquito-borne disease.

Our staff will respond to mosquito complaints and apply mosquito control products from early spring into the fall. You can help us to protect your community from mosquito-borne disease by routinely following the steps listed above.



PRE-SALE PASSES FOR NON-RESIDENTS (CUYAHOGA HEIGHTS SCHOOL DISTRICT RESIDENTS) ARE \$50.00 PER PERSON (ALL AGES) AND FAMILY PASSES ARE \$125.00.

THESE PASSES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR PRE-SALE PURCHASE ON MONDAY, MAY 5, 2014 – THURSDAY, JUNE 5, 2014. AFTER THAT, PASSES WILL BE SOLD AT THE SWIMMING POOL DURING REGULAR WORKING HOURS AT A PRICE OF \$60.00 PER PERSON, AND \$135.00 FOR THE FAMILY PASS.

THIS YEAR, THE VILLAGE OF BROOKLYN HEIGHTS IS CONTRIBUTING A PORTION OF THE COST. FOR AN INDIVIDUAL PASS, YOU ARE ONLY RESPONSIBLE FOR \$25.00 PER PERSON AND FAMILY PASSES WILL ONLY COST YOU \$75.00.

These charges will be collected at the time you fill out the pool pass information.

Checks should be made payable directly to Cuyahoga Heights Village.

The following information is requested by Cuyahoga Heights to obtain a pool pass:

All sections of the pass must be filled out including the emergency name and phone numbers for all passes. Height, weight, age, color of hair and eyes, allergies or medical problems must also be listed. All pass holders will be required to have their picture taken at the swimming pool the first time the pass is used.

If the children in the family have a different last name than the parent they must have proof of custody of that child. Cuyahoga Heights has the right to question custody rights of any child and will forfeit the pass of a child who does not legally belong to the parent living in Brooklyn Heights.

Non-resident employees who work for our village are not eligible to buy passes.


