NOTICE PARKING ORDINANCE

#452.03

PROHIBITED STANDING OR PARKING PLACES

No person shall stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to comply with the provisions of this title, or while obeying the directions of a police officer or a traffic—control device, in any of the following places:

- (a) On a sidewalk, except a bicycle:
- (b) In front of a public or private driveway:
- (c) Within an intersection:
- (d) Within ten feet of a fire hydrant:
- (e) On a crosswalk:
- (f) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection:
- (g) Within 30 feet of, and upon the approach to, any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic-control device;
- (h) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by a traffic-control device;
- (i) Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing:
- (j) Within 20 feet of a driveway entrance to any fire station and, on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within 75 feet of the entrance when it is properly posted with signs:
- (k) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such standing or parking would obstruct traffic:
- (I) Alongside any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street:
- (m)Upon any bridge or elevated structure upon a highway, or within a highway tunnel:
- (n)At any place where signs prohibit stopping:
- (o) Within one foot of another parked vehicle:
- (p)On the roadway portion of a freeway, expressway, or thruway.



The Federal Emergency Management Agency released a residential training program to help familiarize residents in the various aspects of how large scale disasters will affect you and what you can do to help yourself, your neighbors and your Police and Fire Departments. We are very thankful to live in communities with excellent Safety Forces.

As seen on the news many times in recent years, major weather events and sudden acts of violence can temporarily overwhelm a community. This course makes you think about emergency planning steps to take for yourself and your family. It will help you understand the broad complexities of these events by introducing you to preparation already established in your community.

EMERGENCY EDUCATION FOR RESIDENTS

Disaster Medical Operations - Part One / Wednesday, June 19th

In this module you will learn about Life-Threatening Conditions and Triage. How to recognize and treat and airway obstruction, bleeding, and shock and the principles of triage and how to conduct triage evaluations.

Instructor: Connie Skalsky

Disaster Medical Operations - Part Two / Wednesday, June 26th

In this unit you will learn about Public Health Considerations - How to maintain hygiene and sanitation; Functions of Disaster Medical Operations - What the five major functions of disaster medical operations are and how they are set up; Disaster Medical Treatment Areas: How to establish them and what their functions are and Patient Evaluation - How to perform a head-to-toe assessment to identify and treat injuries. It includes Basic Treatment - How to treat burns, dress and bandage wounds, treat fractures, dislocations, sprains, and strains, treat hypothermia, treat heat-related injuries, control nasal bleeding and treat bites and stings.

Instructors: Connie Skalsky & Elizabeth Sourek

The need for residents to learn disaster medical operations is based on two assumptions: The number of victims could exceed the local capacity for treatment. Survivors will attempt to assist others. As CERT members you will need to know lifesaving first aid or post-disaster survival techniques. In a disaster there may be more victims than rescuers, and assistance from medical professionals may not be immediately available.

These classes are designed for the average, non-medical citizen!


