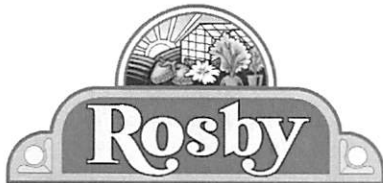

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO WHEN A DEER - VEHICLE COLLISION IS INEVITABLE?

Advice on what to do should you encounter a deer while driving.

- Scan roadsides for deer, especially at dawn & after sunset, more than half of crashes occur between 5 p.m. & midnight. Have your passengers keep their eyes on roadsides & warn you when they spot a deer.
- Watch for deer-crossing signs & drive with extra caution.
- If you see one deer, expect others.
- Use your high beams as much as possible to spot glowing eyes and silhouettes before they enter the road.
- Blast your horn the second you see any roadside animal, which may turn them back or speed their crossing. One long blast of your car horn works better to alert a deer than several short blasts.
- Brake firmly when you see a deer in front of you, but stay in your lane. Always wear your seat belt, keep beverages in cup holders & place bags & purses on the floor, so you aren't reluctant to hit your brakes.

Consider Alternatives to Road Salt This Winter

Keeping roads and parking areas free of ice and snow is an essential part of modern life. However, road salt – one of the main tools used to achieve this task – contains chloride as its principal ingredient. Chloride does more than melt snow and ice; it can harm local lakes and rivers. Other minor ingredients of commercial road salt include arsenic and cyanide. Overusing chloride can also damage residential greenery such as grass, plants, and trees, reversing any beautification efforts you have made.

As snow and ice melt, they drain into landscaped areas or storm sewers, and then to natural bodies of water. Waters from a deiced area contain high levels of chlorides, which do not degrade, and there is no cost effective way to remove it. Excessive levels of chlorides can severely impair the ability of plants to absorb water and nutrients. These negative effects are common to both aquatic and terrestrial plants in residential gardens, landscaped areas, and rivers. Fish and other aquatic organisms are then impacted because of polluted habitats.

Roads must remain clear to protect public safety, and in no way is it being suggested that we cease the application road salt. However, many communities are already employing alternative technologies to deice their roads, such as anti-icing, which applies salt brine to roads when a storm is forecasted, and prevents the formation of ice. Residents can use a similar treatment method by purchasing a deicing alternative to salt available from some grocers or hardware stores. If you must use salt, consider the “Just Enough” principle – applying just enough salt to keep your driveway and sidewalks ice-free.

Steps you can take to help reduce the impacts of road salt:

- Shovel (or use a snow blower) before you use any product; never put a deicing product on top of snow.
- Adopt the “Just Enough” principle, putting down just enough product to keep high traffic areas clear of ice.
- Consider switching to a non-chloride deicer.

NATIONAL MEMORY SCREENING DAY

Residents who want a status check on their memory can take advantage of free, confidential screenings on December 3rd at the Community Center at the bi-monthly senior social. The Community Services Department, will hold memory screenings at the Senior Social, 12:30 - 2:00 p.m. on December 3rd. The event features a face-to-face screening, which takes only about five minutes, and consists of a series of questions and tasks. It is administered by our social worker and is completely confidential. The results do not represent a diagnosis, and AFA advises those individuals with below-normal scores or those who have normal scores but are still concerned, to follow up with a qualified healthcare professional. You must pre-register by calling 739-3702. Transportation is available.



HEAP - INCREASED ELIGIBILITY AMOUNTS FOR 2013-14

The State of Ohio has increased the eligibility amounts for the HEAP 2013-14 winter program. You may qualify if your income is \$20,108 or less for a one-person household and \$27,143 for a two-person household. For each additional person in the household, add \$7,035. HEAP assists families with winter heating bills and is a one-time credit on your account. You must re-apply to this program every year with proof of income.



SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL

Seniors, age 65+ with no household member under the age of 65, and, disabled residents (with proof from a medical doctor) can apply. Cost is \$75 for the season, unless approved for HEAP for the 2013-14 year. HEAP-approved applicants will pay \$30. Late registration may result in your drive not getting plowed if we have an early snowfall! The application is attached and can be dropped off at the Community Services office.

Community Services holds a senior social twice-monthly at the Community Center. **All seniors are welcome** and encouraged to attend! Socials are from Noon to 2:00 p.m. unless otherwise noted and lunch is always served. Please sign up by calling 739-3702. Village transportation is available - just request it when you call!

2013-14 Senior Snow Removal Program **OUTLINE**

ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

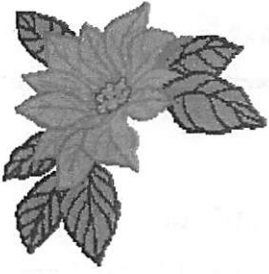
COST

- There will be a charge of \$75 per senior household, for the service. A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2013-14 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$30.

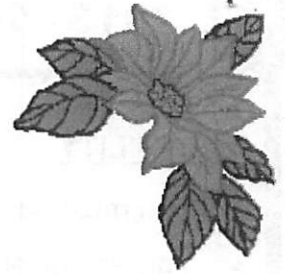
OUTLINE

- This is a basic snow plowing service. In severe weather conditions, plowing may be delayed.
- This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.
- We may wait until after a snow storm has passed before plowing.
- Your street address must be visible from the street.
- If a car is in your driveway while plowing occurs, this will limit the area which will be plowed.
- The driveways are plowed in an assigned order. If the house around the corner is plowed before yours, please be sure that your street will be done in a timely manner. If you have a corner lot, your drive will be plowed by the truck handling your street address.
- If your sidewalk or the street is plowed by the Village after the subcontractor has plowed your drive, we cannot get back out and re-do all of the drives.
- If your drive has been cleared by someone else before the contractor has been there, the contractor will skip your house as it "appears to have been cleared".
- If your drive is missed or there are any problems, please call the Community Service office - on the day of the occurrence. All calls should be made to 739-3702. Messages will be returned as soon as possible. Please do not call the sub-contractor or the Service Department.
- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems, etc.. must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 16, 2014. No reports will be honored after this date.

Please do what you can to help a child have a memorable Christmas.



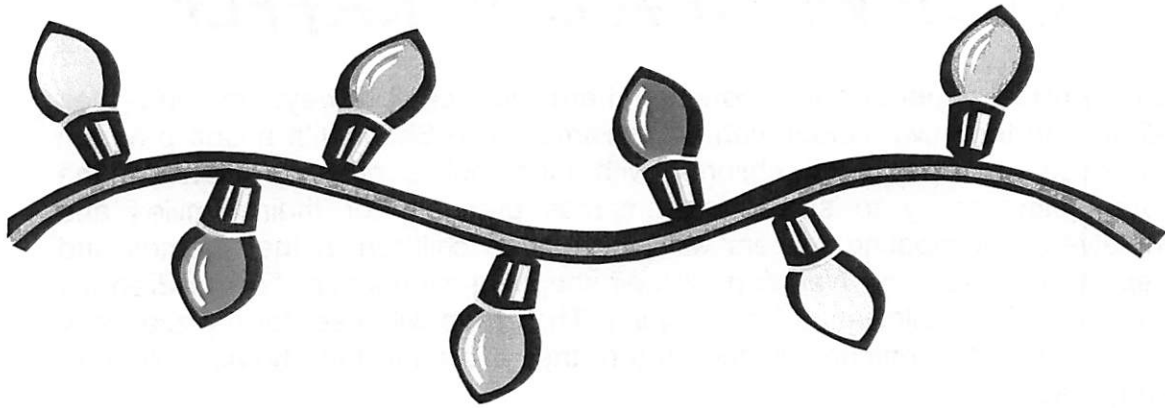
