618.07 BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS

No person shall own, harbor or keep in custody a dog which disturbs the peace by barking, yelping, howling or making other loud noises to the annoyance and/or discomfort of any person. Continuous barking, yelping, howling and/or making other loud noises for 15 consecutive minutes by such dog, whether confined inside a residence or building or to the outside area, shall be deemed to have disturbed the peace and to have caused the annoyance and discomfort of persons: provided, that at the time of the complaint, no person or persons were trespassing or threatening to trespass upon the private property of the owner, and provided that the dog was not being teased or provoked in any manner.

VILLAGE FOOD PANTRY OPEN TO ALL QUALIFYING RESIDENTS

The Village Food Pantry is available for all eligible households. Annual income eligibility requirements are \$22,339 for a one-person household; \$30,259 for a two-person household; \$38,179 for a three-person household. Add \$7,920 for each additional household member. The Pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. Availability of items varies. Pantry visits are by appointment only during normal business hours. Shut-in residents may call and request delivery.

"Can You Hear Me" Calls Reported in Ohio

Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine warned that several Ohioans have reported suspicious calls from callers asking "Can you hear me?"

Similar calls have been reported throughout the country as part of an alleged scam to trick consumers into responding "Yes" and using their response to place unauthorized charges on their phone or utility bill.

"Any time people receive a call that's suspicious, we encourage them to be very careful and not to respond to the call," Attorney General DeWine said. "When in doubt, just hang up. If you need help or if you suspect a scam, contact the Ohio Attorney General's Office."

In reports to the Ohio Attorney General's Office, consumers generally say the calls appeared to come from a local phone number, such as a number showing a 614 (Columbus) or 330 (Akron) area code. Some consumers said the callers claimed the consumer had won a vacation or cruise or claimed to work for an extended warranty company.

Tips to avoid potential phone scams include:

- ◆ Don't respond to suspicious calls. Let the calls go to voicemail, or hang up if a call seems questionable in any way, especially if it's an automated telemarketing call (or "robocall"), which is used commonly in scams.
- ◆ Don't always trust caller ID. Even when calls appear to come from an Ohio phone number, the numbers could be spoofed or the calls could be made over the Internet, meaning the caller could be located somewhere else entirely. Check your phone bill and your credit card statements regularly. If you find suspicious charges, immediately report them to your provider.

Consumers who suspect a scam or who want help resolving a consumer problem should contact the Ohio Attorney General's Office at www.OhioProtects.org or 800-282-0515.

Six Signs of a Scam

Scams are growing as a way to acquire money from others, under false pretenses. It is vital that everyone be aware of possible scams and know how to respond to them, so as not to be taken advantage. Never was the phrase "Buyer beware," more accurate than when it comes to scams.

You can educate yourself by seeking out information on scams in conversations with others, in written articles and in stories on the news through television and radio.

If someone contacts you with an offer that sounds too good to refuse, look for the following red flags:

- ◆ If you are asked to send a small amount of money to win big money.
- ◆ If they offer to send you money and you are told to keep some for yourself and send the rest elsewhere.
- ◆ If you are asked to wire money to someone you do not know.
- ◆ If you are asked to use a Green Dot card to pay for something or to someone you do not know.
- ◆ If you are asked to provide personal information over the phone and you did not initiate the call.
- ◆ If you are asked not to talk to others and or to act quickly.
- ◆ If they want you to donate money, but refuse to send you information in the mail first.





Before sending money or sharing personal information, always consult with a family member, trusted friend, or the Police Department.



UH Parma Medical Center's Community Outreach Nurses will be conducting the following screenings:

NON-FASTING CHOLESTEROL

This screening is a finger prick test and will give you total cholesterol, HDL and blood sugar. This screening take approximately 7 minutes to get your results.

BONE DENSITY

Screening is open to both men and women and is done on the bare heel of your foot. No panty hose. This screening will give you a base level of density in your bones and results are given to you in about 10 minutes.

BLOOD PRESSURES

Nurses will use a blood pressure cuff to measure your blood pressure. Results will be given to you immediately.

STROKE ASSESSMENT

Our Stroke Educator will give you a questionnaire to fill out asking about medical history and family history. The nurse educator will use the answers on the questionnaire along with the results from your non-fasting cholesterol and blood pressure screenings and will let you know your risk factors of having a stroke. This screening takes about 7-10 minutes.

GLUCOSE SCREENING

A non-fasting finger prick test to measure your blood sugar level. Results take about 3-5 minutes.

ATRIAL FIBRILLATION SCREENING

Dr. Arthur Ulatowski, DO, Cardiologist will be conducting a non-invasive Atrial Fibrillation screening using the pulse in your finger. Atrial Fibrillation also known as A-Fib is a random fluttering of your heart. Results will be given to you and the screening takes about 3-5 minutes.


