2013 Lawn Cutting Program OUTLINE

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your inability to perform this task must be submitted with your application.

PROGRAM COST

- There will be a charge of \$200 per senior household, per year for the service. Check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The program cost for HEAP recipients is \$80.

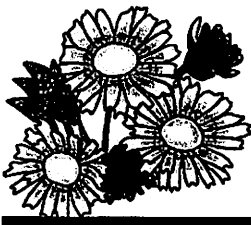

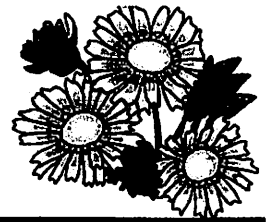
- The cutting of your lawn, driveway and sidewalk edged and grass around trees trimmed.

- Your lawn is one of many being serviced. Please be patient.
- Your lawn will not necessarily be cut on the same day each week .
- Use of a small mower is at the discretion of the contractor ONLY.
- All dog dropping must be picked up! Any yard with dog droppings, will not be cut.
- Your yard may not be cut if you have a vehicle blocking the entry to the back yard, laundry on the clothesline, obstacles on or hanging over the lawn, including large hedges and bushes.

SENIOR LAWN CUTTING PROGRAM

Lawn cutting will begin in April and continue through the end of October, or as weather dictates. This program serves seniors age 65+ and disabled residents, who have no able-bodied household member. If you need this assistance, but are under age 65, you may be eligible - please submit an application including a current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability.

The cost of the program is \$200 per senior household, per year. There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed.

A program application is attached and the deadline to apply is April 15th. All calls regarding the Lawn Cutting program should be made to the Community Service Dept. at 739-3702.

Cuyahoga County Urges Education for 9-1-1



April is designated as National 9-1-1 Education Month. 911 Education Month promotes awareness of the vital link between citizens and emergency responders. There are many things parents can do to ensure their family's safety. During 911 Education Month we are encouraging parents to teach their children how to use 9-1-1 properly from an early age, which may one day save a life.

9-1-1 is a universal number that should only be called in the event of an emergency.

Cuyahoga County is urging all educational school organizations, parents, and caregivers to assist with teaching their children how to properly use 9-1-1 during the month of April as part of National 9-1-1 Education Month.

Below are a few of the most important activities you can do and messages you can relay to children about using 9-1-1 during an emergency:

- 9-1-1 is for police, fire, and medical emergencies.
- Know the location of the emergency. Providing an accurate address is critically important when making a wireless 9-1-1 call.
- If you call 9-1-1, don't hang up.
- Don't call 9-1-1 for jokes or prank calls.
- When you call 9-1-1, pay attention to the questions that you are being asked.
- Stay on the line with the 9-1-1 call taker and answer all questions. The more information they have, the better they are able to help you.
- Stay calm and speak clearly.
- Remember not to allow small children to play with a wireless/cell phone that is currently not in service - cell phones can still call 9-1-1. If you intend to give the phone to children for play, remove the battery.

In an emergency, seconds matter, so being knowledgeable and prepared can make all the difference.

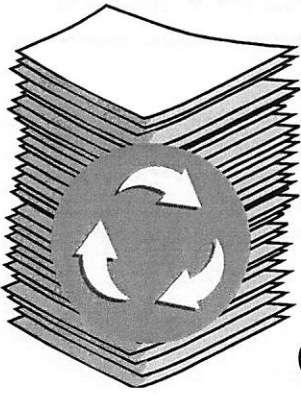

WHAT IF YOUR WALLET WAS LOST OR STOLEN

Don't think it can happen to you? What if it did? What would you do?

The first precaution you should take is to put your cards and documents in your wallet on a photo-copy machine, copy both sides, and put the copy in a safe place (not in your purse). Now you have the information you need to quickly make the necessary calls should a loss or theft occur. Most importantly, call the three national credit reporting organizations to place a fraud alert on your name and Social Security number. Companies that check your credit will then know your information was stolen. They have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit. The credit organizations numbers are:

Equifax (800) 525-6285

Experian (888) 397-3742

TransUnion (800) 680-7289

The Social Security Administration fraud line is (800) 269-0271. You should also file a police report in the jurisdiction where your wallet was lost.

Consumers are entitled to one free credit report each year and can use a new web site called AnnualCreditReport.com or request it by phone call or letter. The toll free number consumers can call is (877) 322-8228. Written requests can be sent to Annual Credit Report Request Service, P.O. Box 105281, Atlanta GA 30348.

Studies indicate that four in five credit reports contain some error. Mistakes can be as simple as a mistyped address, or as complicated as a list of defaulted loans, taken out by an identity thief in the victim's name and never repaid. Consumers can dispute errors by following the instructions listed on the credit reports they receive. Procedures may differ slightly among companies. Be sure you dispute everything that's wrong and follow up. If you don't get satisfaction, find an attorney.

PLANTING TREES TO IMPROVE WATER QUALITY

The problem is polluted stormwater runoff. Trees provide more than just shade and habitat in your yard . . . They can also help protect our water resources! During rain events, pollutants such as fertilizers and pesticides applied in excess of suggested rates, slow drips of oil from cars, and trash are washed away and carried to the closest storm drain, creating polluted stormwater runoff. Unlike our sanitary sewers, what goes into our storm drains is not treated and eventually will empty into a local stream, river or lake. Also, fast moving stormwater can destroy habitats along stream banks and the resulting sediment further destroys habitats by smothering the bottom layer of rocks in streams, rivers and lakes. Pollution and debris in stormwater not only limit the amount of aquatic life that can survive, but it can be costly to clean water resources for drinking and recreation.

Planting trees is part of the solution to reduce the negative impacts of stormwater to our local streams, rivers or lakes. Below are several benefits of trees to water quality:

- Urban forests can reduce annual stormwater runoff by 2 - 7 percent.
- A mature tree can store 50 to 100 gallons of water during large storms.
- Trees improve rainwater infiltration into the soil, which filters out impurities and reduces the amount of pollutants that reach streams.
- Trees provide habitat for hundreds of wildlife species.
- Shaded surfaces may be 20 - 45 degrees cooler than the peak temperatures of similar un-shaded surfaces.
