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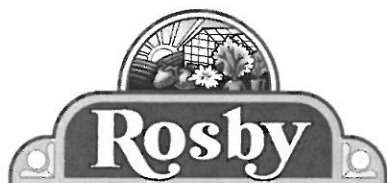

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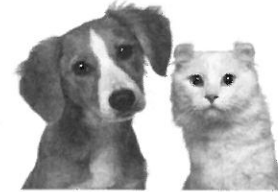
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REMINDER TO VILLAGE RESIDENTS . . OVERNIGHT PARKING & SNOW EMERGENCY ORDINANCES

452.13 OVERNIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED

No person shall; park or cause to be parked, any motor vehicle on any residential street in the Village from 3:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.

(Ord. 13-75. Passed 3-4-75).

452.17 SNOW EMERGENCIES

(a) Whenever, during any period of 24 hours or less, snow falls in the Village to a depth of 2 inches or more, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, in that such a heavy snow storm constitutes a serious public hazard, impairing transportation, the movement of food and fuel supplies, medical care, fire, health and police protection, and other vital facilities of the Village. Such emergency shall continue until an announcement by the Mayor that snow plowing operations have been completed, which announcement shall be made in the same manner as set forth in subsection (b) hereof for the commencement of the emergency.

(b) Whenever such an emergency exists, the Mayor shall request the cooperation of the local press and of the radio and television stations to announce the emergency and the time that emergency parking regulations will become effective, which time shall be

no sooner than one hour after the first announcement, and such announcement, by two local radio stations or local television stations, or in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the Village, shall constitute notice to the general public of the existence of the emergency. However, the owners and operators of motor vehicles shall have full responsibility to determine existing weather conditions and the depth of the snow and to comply with the emergency parking regulations.

(c) During the period of such emergency, no person shall park, cause to be parked, permit to be parked, permit to remain parked, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle of any kind upon any street or highway within the Village, provided, however, that vehicles may be parked for a period of not longer than 5 minutes for actual loading or unloading of property, if such loading and unloading do not otherwise violate another ordinance of the Village.

ATTENTION VILLAGE RESIDENTS

Just a reminder that winter is upon us, and the rules for snow plowing are as follows:

660.16 DEPOSIT OF SNOW AND ICE

(A) On Public Sidewalks and Streets. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited, any snow or ice from private property, including, but not limited to, driveways and private sidewalks, onto a public sidewalk or the traveled portion of a street. The presence of deposited snow or ice on a public sidewalk or the traveled portion of a street shall be prima-facie evidence that the owner or owners of the private property abutting such deposit made such deposit or caused the same to be made.

(B) On Public Streets and Tree Lawns.

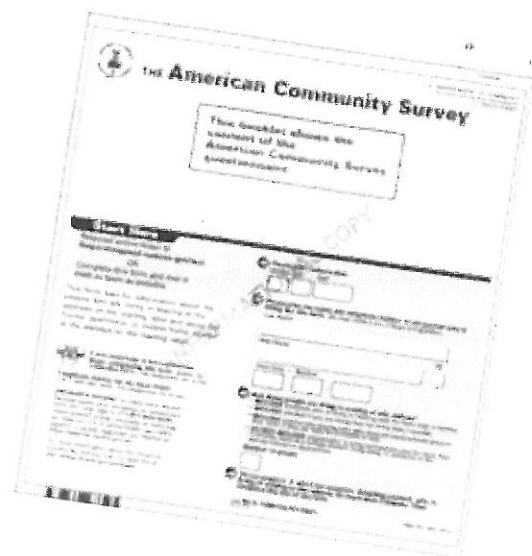
(1) No person shall remove snow from his or her property, or from those portions of a highway commonly called a tree lawn, being those portions of the highway on either side thereof, including the apron driveways constructed therein, between the dedicated or established boundary lines of the highway and the traveled portion thereof, and deposit the same upon any portion of the highway, including the traveled portion thereof, or upon any tree lawn.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (b) (1) hereof shall not apply to or prohibit a person from removing snow from his or her apron driveway and depositing the same in another portion of his or her tree lawn.

U.S. CENSUS UPDATE



We have learned that in addition to the once-a-decade census, the Census Bureau will be conducting on-going surveys to keep population information current.

You may be selected for survey by mail, telephone or in person with a Census representative.

The most current phase of this project is called the ***American Community Survey***.

We contacted the Census Bureau and learned the following to help keep you safe:

If you are selected to participate you should receive a postcard in the mail prior to being contacted.

The Census employees will NEVER:

- Ask for Social Security Numbers
- Ask for money or donations
- Send requests on behalf of a political party
- Request PIN codes, passwords or similar access information for credit cards, banks or other financial accounts.

Employees that conduct in-person surveys MUST:

- Show you their Census Bureau identification badge
- Tell you the name of the survey for which your participation is needed
- Provide a copy of the notification letter you received or should have received, in the mail describing the survey.

If you are in doubt, contact the regional Census office 1-800-262-4236. Suspicious activity or unwanted visitors should always be reported to the police. A legitimate census employee will patiently wait until their identity is verified.

HEAP - INCREASED ELIGIBILITY AMOUNTS FOR 2012-2013

The State of Ohio has increased the eligibility amounts for the HEAP 2012-13 winter program. You may qualify if your income is \$22,340 or less for a one-person household and \$30,260 for a two-person household. For each additional person in the household, add \$5,940. HEAP assists families with winter heating bills and is a one-time credit. You must re-apply to this program every year with proof of income.



USED CELL PHONES & ELECTRONICS

The Community Services Department collects used cell phones, digital cameras, laptops, game systems, and iPods for a recycling program through the National Council On Aging.
