Planting Trees to Improve Water Quality

The problem is polluted stormwater runoff. Trees provide more than just shade and habitat in your yard . . They can also help protect our water resources! During rain events, pollutants such as fertilizers and pesticides applied in excess of suggested rates, slow drips of oil from cars, and trash are washed away and carried to the closest storm drain, creating polluted stormwater runoff. Unlike our sanitary sewers, what goes into our storm drains is not treated and eventually will empty into a local stream, river or lake. Also, fast moving stormwater can destroy habitats along stream banks and the resulting sediment further destroys habitats by smothering the bottom layer of rocks in steams, rivers and lakes. Pollution and debris in stormwater not only limit the amount off aquatic life that can survive, but it can be costly to clean water resources for drinking and recreation.

Planting trees is part of the solution to reduce the negative impacts of stormwater to our local streams, rivers or lakes. Below are several benefits of trees to water quality:

- Urban forests can reduce annual stormwater runoff by 2 7 percent.
- A mature tree can store 50 to 100 gallons of water during large storms.
- Trees improve rainwater infiltration into the soil, which filters out impurities and reduces the amount of pollutants that reach streams.
- Trees provide habitat for hundreds of wildlife species.
- Shaded surfaces may be 20 45 degrees cooler than the peak temperatures of similar un-shaded surfaces.

618.07 BARKING OR HOWLING DOGS

No person shall own, harbor or keep in custody a dog which disturbs the peace by barking, yelping, howling or making other loud noises to the annoyance and/or discomfort of any person. Continuous barking, yelping, howling and/or making other loud noises for 15 consecutive minutes by such dog, whether confined inside a residence or building or to the outside area, shall be deemed to have disturbed the peace and to have caused the annoyance and discomfort of persons: provided, that at the time of the complaint, no person or persons were trespassing or threatening to trespass upon the private property of the owner, and provided that the dog was not being teased or provoked in any manner.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION NEEDLES & SYRINGES

Instructions for safe needle disposal

Used needles and syringes from self-injections may be placed in the regular trash if the following precautions are followed. These precautions are designed to protect sanitation workers and other workers in the waste industry from being struck by a needle.

Requirements for Safe Needle Disposal

Place used needles and syringes in a rigid plastic container with a sealable lid such as a Sharps container or a plastic laundry detergent bottle with a screw top.

- Seal the lid with tape
- Place the container in your regular trash
- Do not place the container in with your recyclables.



Unlike other scams that involve selling or giving something to a potential victim, in this scam the con artist is asking to receive some assistance... and in the process obtains account information or access to funds.

Example: Someone claiming to be a bank examiner, bank security officer or police officer calls asking for help investigating a possible fraud by withdrawing cash from your bank account or providing account information. If the trick works, the bogus investigator can walk away with the money or use the confidential information to raid the victim's bank account. **BE CAREFUL!!**


