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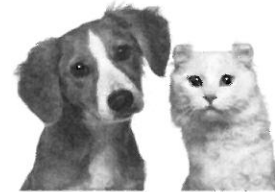
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REMINDER TO VILLAGE RESIDENTS . . OVERNIGHT PARKING & SNOW EMERGENCY ORDINANCES

452.13 OVERNIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED

No person shall; park or cause to be parked, any motor vehicle on any residential street in the Village from 3:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.

(Ord. 13-75. Passed 3-4-75).

452.17 SNOW EMERGENCIES

(a) Whenever, during any period of 24 hours or less, snow falls in the Village to a depth of 2 inches or more, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, in that such a heavy snow storm constitutes a serious public hazard, impairing transportation, the movement of food and fuel supplies, medical care, fire, health and police protection, and other vital facilities of the Village. Such emergency shall continue until an announcement by the Mayor that snow plowing operations have been completed, which announcement shall be made in the same manner as set forth in subsection (b) hereof for the commencement of the emergency.

(b) Whenever such an emergency exists, the Mayor shall request the cooperation of the local press and of the radio and television stations to announce the emergency and the time that emergency parking regulations will become effective, which time shall be

no sooner than one hour after the first announcement, and such announcement, by two local radio stations or local television stations, or in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the Village, shall constitute notice to the general public of the existence of the emergency. However, the owners and operators of motor vehicles shall have full responsibility to determine existing weather conditions and the depth of the snow and to comply with the emergency parking regulations.

(c) During the period of such emergency, no person shall park, cause to be parked, permit to be parked, permit to remain parked, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle of any kind upon any street or highway within the Village, provided, however, that vehicles may be parked for a period of not longer than 5 minutes for actual loading or unloading of property, if such loading and unloading do not otherwise violate another ordinance of the Village.

ATTENTION VILLAGE RESIDENTS

Just a reminder that winter is upon us, and the rules for snow plowing are as follows:

660.16 DEPOSIT OF SNOW AND ICE

(A) On Public Sidewalks and Streets. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited, any snow or ice from private property, including, but not limited to, driveways and private sidewalks, onto a public sidewalk or the traveled portion of a street. The presence of deposited snow or ice on a public sidewalk or the traveled portion of a street shall be prima-facie evidence that the owner or owners of the private property abutting such deposit made such deposit or caused the same to be made.

(B) On Public Streets and Tree Lawns.

(1) No person shall remove snow from his or her property, or from those portions of a highway commonly called a tree lawn, being those portions of the highway on either side thereof, including the apron driveways constructed therein, between the dedicated or established boundary lines of the highway and the traveled portion thereof, and deposit the same upon any portion of the highway, including the traveled portion thereof, or upon any tree lawn.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (b) (1) hereof shall not apply to or prohibit a person from removing snow from his or her apron driveway and depositing the same in another portion of his or her tree lawn.

HEAP - INCREASED ELIGIBILITY AMOUNTS FOR 2012-2013

The State of Ohio has increased the eligibility amounts for the HEAP 2012-13 winter program. You may qualify if your income is \$22,340 or less for a one-person household and \$30,260 for a two-person household. For each additional person in the household, add \$5,940. HEAP assists families with winter heating bills and is a one-time credit. You must re-apply to this program every year with proof of income.



SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL

Seniors, age 65+ with no household member under the age of 65, and, disabled residents can apply. Cost is \$75 for the season, unless approved for HEAP for the 2012-13 year. HEAP-approved applicants will pay \$30. **PLEASE NOTE: This is a BASIC snow plow program and in severe weather conditions plowing may be delayed until the storm has passed. THIS SHOULD BE A SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICE IF YOUR DRIVE NEEDS TO BE CLEARED BY A CERTAIN TIME.**



2012 -13 Senior Snow Removal Program APPLICATION

ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

COST

- **There will be a charge of \$75 per senior household, for the service.** A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted.
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2012-13 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$30.

OUTLINE

- This is a basic snow plowing service. In severe weather conditions, plowing may be delayed.
- We cannot guarantee that your drive will be plowed first thing in the morning. **This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.**
- The contractor is called out at the discretion of the Village and **we may wait until after a snow storm has passed before plowing.**
- Your street address must be visible from the street.
- If a car is in your driveway while plowing occurs, this limits the area which can be plowed.
- The driveways are plowed in an assigned order. If the house around the corner is plowed before yours, please be sure that your street will be done in a timely manner. If you have a corner lot, your drive will be plowed by the truck handling your street address.
- If your sidewalk or the street is plowed by the Village after the subcontractor has plowed your drive, we cannot get back out and re-do all of the drives. We apologize for this inconvenience.
- If your drive has been cleared by someone else before the contractor has been called out, the contractor will skip your house as it "appears to have been cleared".
- If your drive is missed or there are any problems, please call the Community Service office - on the day of the occurrence. All calls should be made to 739-3702. Messages will be returned as soon as possible, including evenings and weekends. Please do not call the sub-contractor or the Service Department.
- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 17, 2013. No reports will be honored after this date.
