INVEST IN HOME SECURITY: SAFETY TIPS

- If you've just moved into a new house, rekey the locks & consider whether you need to upgrade to a high security lock.
- Whenever possible, purchase keys that are protected against unauthorized duplication.

CHECK THE DOORS

Locks aren't as effective if they're on flimsy doors.

- Make sure all exterior doors & frames are solid wood or metal.
- Doors should fit tightly in their frames, with hinge pins on the inside.
- Install a peephole or wide-angle viewer in all entry doors, so you can see who is outside without opening the door. Door chains are not a security device—they break easily & won't keep out an intruder.

CHECK THE OUTSIDE

To discourage burglars from selecting your home as their target of opportunity, make sure to

- Prune back shrubbery that hides doors or windows. Cut back tree limbs that could help a thief climb into windows.
- Light porches, entrances. & yards- front & back.
 Consider timers that turn on outside lights or install motion detectors.
- Keep your yard well-maintained. Store ladders
 tools inside your locked garage, basement, or storage shed when you're not using them.
- Clearly display your house number so police & other emergency vehicles can find your home quickly.
- Help the neighborhood stay in good shape. Dark alleys, broken street lights, abandoned cars, vacant buildings, graffiti, litter, & run-down areas attract crime. Work with the local government and neighbors to organize community clean-up days.
- Put lights & a radio on timers to create the illusion that someone is at home when you go away. Leave shades, blinds, & curtains in normal positions. Stop the mail & news-papers, or ask a neighbor to take them in.
- Update your home inventory, listing things like electronic & sports equipment & computers.
 Take photos or make videos of items, list descriptions & serial numbers. Check with law enforcement about Operation Identification-

engraving your valuables. If you home is burglarized, this can help identify stolen items & make insurance claims easier to file.

BURGLARS CAN TAKE MORE THAN YOUR PROPERTY

Burglars generally don't want to run into their victims. But if they're surprised by someone coming home or pick a home that's occupied, someone may get hurt.

- If you see a screen slit, a window broken, or a door ajar, don't go in. Call the police from a neighbor's house or a public phone.
- If you hear a noise in the night that sounds like someone breaking in or moving around, call the police & wait for them to come. If you can leave safely, do so. Otherwise lock yourself in a room or, if the intruder is in the room, pretend to be asleep.
- Think carefully before buying a firearm for protection. Guns can be stolen & sold to anyone, or captured & used on you or the police. If you do own a gun, lock it up & learn how to use it safely.

CHECK THE LOCKS

In almost half of all residential burglaries, thieves walk in through an unlocked door or crawl through an unlocked window.

- Make sure every external door has a least a 1" bolt & can provide protection against picking, drilling, & other forms of physical attack.
- Secure sliding glass doors with commercially available locks or with a broomstick or wooden dowel in the track to jam the door against intruders. Insert a pin in a hole drilled in the sliding door frame that goes through the fixed frame to prevent anyone from lifting the door off its track.
- Secure double-hung windows by sliding a bolt or nail through a hole drilled at a downward angle in each top corner of the inside sash and part way through the outside sash. Secure basement windows as well.
- Don't hide keys in mailboxes, planters, or under doormats. Give an extra key to a neighbor you can trust.



SENIOR LAWN CUTTING PROGRAM RETURNS!

Through the generous support of Mayor Procuk and Village Council, the Senior Lawn Cutting Program will be offered to our senior and disabled residents!

Lawn cutting will begin in April and continue through the end of October, or as weather dictates. This program serves seniors age 65+ and disabled residents, who have no able-bodied household member. If you need this assistance, but are under age 65, you may be eligible - please submit an application including a current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability.

The cost of the program is \$200 per senior household, per year. There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed

A program application is attached and the deadline to apply is April 15th. All calls regarding the Lawn Cutting program should be made to the Community Service Dept. at 739-3702.

COMMUNITY SERVICES BRINGS BACK SOCIAL WORKER!

Also through the support of Mayor Mike and Council, Licensed Social Worker, Julia Ellifritt, returns to the staff and is available to any resident without cost. FOOD PANTRY

The Project Hope Food Pantry, located at the Community Services Office, is available per these eligibility requirements: \$22,339 for a one-person household; \$30,259 for a two-person household; \$38,179 for a three-person household. The Pantry contains fresh poultry, meat, dairy items, canned goods, paper products, and personal hygiene items. If you meet these requirements you can shop our pantry for free groceries. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of your most current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The program cost for HEAP recipients is \$80.


