VETERANS ALERT: VA ELIMINATES NET WORTH REQUIREMENT FOR HEALTH CARE

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has updated how it determines eligibility for VA health care benefits. The good news is that this makes it easier for many veterans to get access to the benefits. Net worth will no longer be a factor to determine eligibility and copayments.

Previously, veterans who did not fit into certain categories were required to provide their income and net worth before receiving benefits. If a veteran's combined income and net worth exceeded certain limits, copayments were required to receive health benefits. Therefore, some low-income veterans, with a high net worth, were faced with copayments. Under the new rule, that became effective in March 2015, the VA will now only consider a veteran's gross household income and deductible expenses from the previous year. While veterans whose income exceeds the income thresholds will still be required to pay a copay, the VA estimates that with the new rule 190,000 veterans will become eligible for reduced health care costs over a five-year period.

BABY SITTERS GUIDE TO BEING SAFE

Baby sitting is a great way to earn money, help neighbors & gain some job experience. But it's also a big responsibility to be in charge of someone else's children in an unfamiliar home, & it can be a bit scary.

Here are some guidelines to help you be a first-rate baby sitter.

GETTING JOB DONE

- Baby-sit only for people you know or who have been referred by a friend. Answering newspaper ads is not as safe
 as agreeing to sit for a friend of the family.
- When someone asks you to baby-sit, find out what time the parents expect to be back & tell them how much you charge & whether you have a curfew. Discuss how you'll get there & back safely.
- Leave the name, address & phone number of where you'll be sitting with your parents or a trusted friend. Tell them what time your employer expects to be home.

ON THE JOB

- Before the parents leave, have them write down the name, address & phone number of where they will be. You
 should also have phone numbers for the local police/fire/ambulance services, the poison control center, a neighbor
 or relative & the family doctor. Have the address of where you are sitting next to the phone.
- Be sure you know the locations of all phones in the home in case you need one quickly. If there is an emergency alarm system, learn how to use.
- Know how to work the window & door locks in the house. Use them! Make sure the outside light is on.
- Ask about the children's bedtimes, favorite toys, stories & what they eat. Check on food allergies & medication. Find
 out what you are allowed to eat & drink.
- Be sure to clean up after the children & after yourself. Wash all dishes, cups & utensils that you use & put all toys back in the proper receptacles.
- Get permission & instruction on using the video cassette recorder, stereo, & other appliances.
- Don't tie up the phone talking to your friends. Your employers may want to check in or call about a change in plans.
- A friend should not come over to keep you company unless your employer agrees in advance that it's okay.

IN AN EMERGENCY


- If you suspect a fire, get the children & yourself out. Go to a neighbor's or public phone & call the fire department.
 Then call your employer.
- Stay calm. Children probably won't panic if you don't.

A MINI CHECK LIST FOR SITTERS

- Find out when the parents will return.
- Make sure you know where they are and the phone number
- Write down the street address and phone number of where you are sitting.
- Have emergency phone numbers for police and fire near the phone.
- Include the number of a neighbor on your phone list.
- Ask parents about television, videos, video games, bedtime, play and food rules for the children.

Additional Plastics Now Recycled - In the past only plastic containers labeled #1 (PET) or #2 (HDPE) could be recycled. Kimble is now accepting "rigid" plastic containers labeled #3- #7, in addition to #1's and #2's. Most plastic products are labeled on the bottom with a recycling symbol consisting of arrows that cycle clockwise to form a rounded triangle, and enclosing the number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7. Any rigid food container or other consumer product container labeled in this fashion can now be included for recycling. Examples of plastic containers previously excluded that can now be recycled include salad dressing bottles, peanut butter and jam jars, juice bottles, squeezable bottles (ketchup and mustard), clam shell food containers, microwavable food containers, yogurt containers, margarine tubs, baby milk bottles, shampoo bottles, cooking oil bottles, hand soap bottles, apple sauce cups, cool whip containers, and plastic flower pot containers. Plastic items not acceptable include plastic bags, shrink wrap, Styrofoam, toys, motor oil and antifreeze containers. As you can see, there is a tremendous amount of material which can be diverted from your rubbish cart to your new 65-gallon two wheeled recycling cart. Recycling a ton of plastic saves the energy equivalent of 1,500 gallons of gasoline!

SERVICE REMINDERS

Your collection day remains the same; please remember to set all your residential rubbish and recyclable materials at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your collection day.
