BE WARY: COMPANY CLAIMS ENERGY SAVINGS

Brooklyn Heights Police Officer Dennis Derbin has become aware of companies operating in the area that offer to come and inspect a resident's home and provide the owner with an estimate on making their home more energy efficient.

One such company claims to have an exclusive "Pilot Program" to offer, alleging guaranteed savings of up to 45% on home energy costs.

In researching the company for a resident, Officer Derbin uncovered a significant number of complaints with the Better Business Bureau.

He would like to remind residents to be wary of companies making such claims and offering services for thousands of dollars without first doing some research into the Company offering to perform a service. Additionally, he found that there are very similar programs offered through our local Gas Companies to ensure homes are energy efficient, such as the Energy Star program offered through Dominion East Ohio.

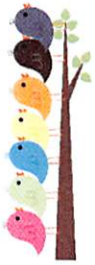

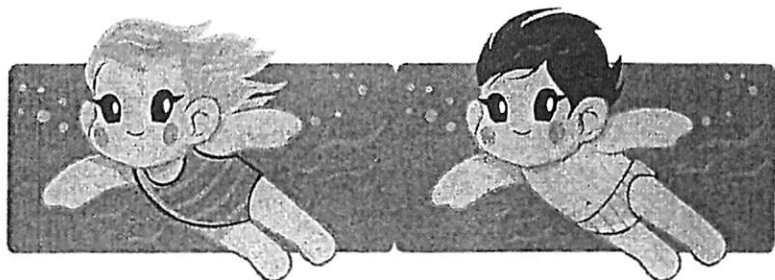
