General Guidelines

Scholarships are available to ANY graduating high school senior living within or attending the Cuyahoga Heights High School District. These scholarships are based on the applicant's volunteer service (minimum of 80 hours), character, student involvement, leadership potential, citizenship and participation in school and/or community activities.

A minimum of five (5) \$100 scholarships will be awarded annually. The governing board, however, may elect to alter the amount of the scholarship or the number of scholarships awarded. A minimum 2.25 GPA is required to be attained during any semester of your first year of college. Scholarship funds will be awarded upon receipt of an official transcript sent to the BHWSC from the accredited institute of higher education.
