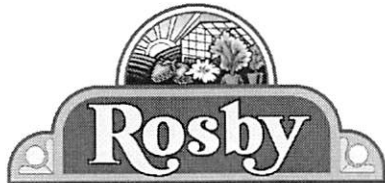

SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL

Seniors, age 65+ and, disabled residents (with proof from a medical doctor) can apply. Cost is \$150 for the season, unless approved for HEAP for the 2018-19 year. HEAP-approved applicants will pay \$60. The HEAP discount will be applied after your acceptance letter is received by our office. The application and outline is attached. Applications can be dropped off at the Community Services office.

CHRISTMAS HOPE TREE

HEAP ENERGY ASSISTANCE

Applications are available for the State of Ohio HEAP Energy Assistance program which provides a one-time benefit to your main heating source. It also qualifies you for a discount on village senior snow removal and grass cutting programs. You must apply every year and applications are available in our office. Income eligibility levels are: 1-person, \$21,245; 2-person, \$28,805; 3-person, \$36,365, etc.

The Library, the Gift that Keeps on Giving

When was the last time you went to the public library? Many say libraries are a dying breed. Oh, how very wrong they are! Using your library card to only check out books? If that's all you're doing with it, you're really missing out. Following are just some of the services offered by your Cuyahoga County Library.

Your library card may allow you to check out:

- Movies
- e-books
- Games, puzzles and children's toys
- Magazines (both hard copies and digital copies)
- CDs
- Video games
- Audio-books (both CDs and digital format)
- Book club kits (enough book copies for your entire group)

It may also allow you to:

- Use library computers and the Internet
- Access special electronic collections (like genealogy databases)
- Reserve rooms or study spaces (either for free or for a nominal charge)
- Reserve new-release books/movies before the library even gets them in
- Use free career services (help with your resume and job applications, access to job listing databases, etc.)
- Stream free movies
- Take online courses
- Participate in special classes and programs, such as summer reading programs; complete with prizes
- Transfer materials from other library systems; inter library loan program
- Get a passport

And If You're Too Busy To Stop By the Library...

No longer a problem. Request an online pin, and you can check out ebooks, digital magazines and movies from home. Don't worry about making it to the library during business hours or getting materials back on time. When books and movies are due, they're automatically removed from your device(s).

2018 – 19 Senior Snow Removal Program **OUTLINE**

ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

COST

- **There will be a charge of \$150 per senior household, for the service.** A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted (we do not have the ability to give change).
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2018-19 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$60. The discount will be applied once your HEAP acceptance letter is received.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.
- This is a basic snow plowing service. In severe weather conditions, plowing may be delayed.

OUTLINE

- Your street address must be visible from the street.
- If a car is in your driveway while plowing occurs, this will limit the area which will be plowed.
- The driveways are plowed in an assigned order. If the house around the corner is plowed before yours, please be sure that your street will be done in a timely manner. If you have a corner lot, your drive will be plowed by the truck handling your street address.
- If your sidewalk or the street is plowed by the Village after the subcontractor has plowed your drive, we cannot get back out and re-do all of the drives.
- If your drive has been cleared by someone else before the contractor has been there, the contractor will skip your house as it "appears to have been cleared".
- If your drive is missed or there are any problems, please call the Community Service office - on the day of the occurrence. All calls should be made to 739-3702. Messages will be returned as soon as possible. Please do not call the sub-contractor or the Service Department.
- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems, etc. must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 17, 2019. No reports will be honored after this date.

Dear Village Residents,

Forgetting to turn your clock **BACK** on **Sunday, November 4, 2018** could cost you some valuable time; forgetting to change the smoke detector's battery could cost you your life! The Brooklyn Heights Fire Department reminds you to change your smoke detector batteries as you reset your clocks from daylight savings time. The time changes in the fall and spring coincide with recommended battery life in a smoke detector. Smoke detectors are present in 92% of American homes, but nearly one-third don't work because of worn or missing batteries. As part of our ongoing effort to make certain that every village household has a working smoke detector, the fire department will accept any resident's request to have their smoke detector batteries replaced. **More importantly, if you do not have a working smoke detector or if it is ten years old or older, please buy one and we will install it for you.** If you would like to participate in this program, please fill out the form below and drop it in the payment box located to the left of the main entrance of our municipal building (345 Tuxedo Ave.) or get it to the Fire Station. I will personally contact you to schedule a date and time.

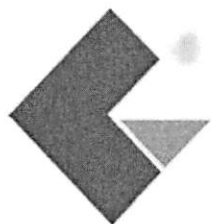

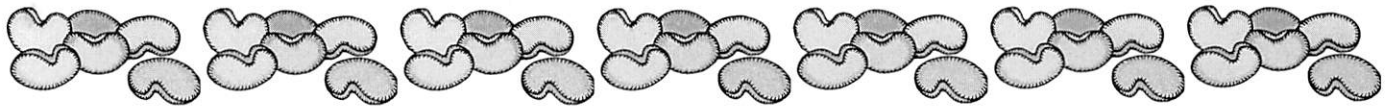

You Can't Predict...But You Can Prepare,

The QUAD CITY Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is a training program that allows civilians and government employees to take the necessary steps in an emergency to save lives. The QUAD CITY CERT Team consists of the communities of Brooklyn Heights, Independence, Seven Hills and Valley View but training is open to everyone. Only residents of these cities, join the QUAD CITY CERT team but certification applies to all.

During an emergency situation, our first responders, who provide fire and medical services, may not be able to meet the demand for these services. Overwhelming number of victims, phone service disrupted and streets blocked will prevent people from accessing Emergency Services. We will have to rely on each other for help in order to meet immediate lifesaving and life sustaining needs. Our CERT volunteers can assist others following these events.

CERTs are not intended to replace a community's response capability, but rather, to serve as an important supplement to it during emergencies when response capabilities are spread thin.

The training program is an all risk, all-hazard training; hands-on and realistic. This valuable course is designed to help you protect yourself, your family, your neighbors and your neighborhood in an emergency situation. CERT members receive 24 training hours (one Wednesday evening a week for 8 weeks).

CERT training is provided free of charge to anyone 14 or over. (Ages 14 to 17 will be required to have parental consent). 24 hours of service credit will be given to students. High school students from the four QUAD CITY communities can also apply for our college scholarships.

The CERT Program trains you in basic disaster response skills:

#1 - Introduction, Disaster Awareness

#2 - Fire Safety

#3 - Disaster Medical Operations (Session 1)

#4 - Disaster Medical Operations (Session 2)

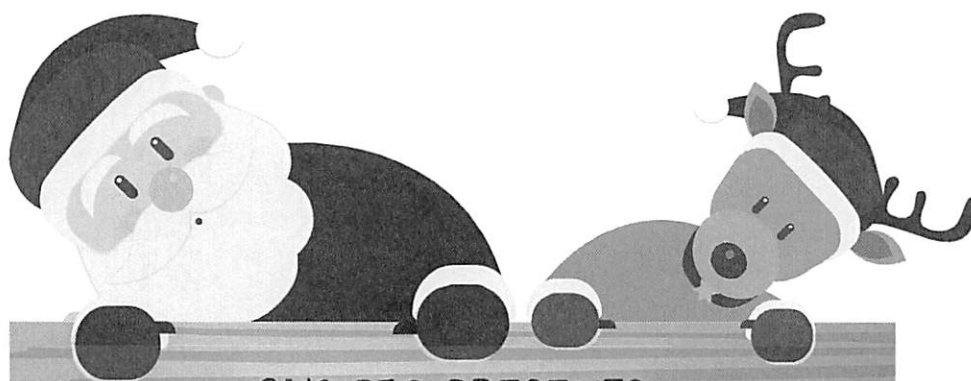
