### Update on DENY THE PERMIT, NO NEW LANDFILL

This morning, October 15<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 am, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health met in a Special Session. The Board Members were once again unanimous and passed two resolutions pertaining to the applicant's inquiries of denial. Resolution 2021-19 revised the Intent to Deny to add reasons for denial including the Health of our residents and the Nuisance created by landfills. The Board also passed unanimously Resolution 2021-20 as an additional Notice of Intent to REVOKE the previous granted expansion on another of their operating sites. Our lawyers and I are monitoring the applicant's actions should any appeals or hearings be requested. I appreciate our Village residents staying informed and ready to attend any such meetings as we continue to Deny the Permit. No New Landfills.

- Communicate with other drivers. Always use your turn signals. And if you have to pull over to drop off or pick up your kids, turn on your hazard lights.

Avoid mail delays...The final accepted postmark date is Monday, November 1st. Worried about the mail?...Use the 24 Hour Drop Box at the Board of Elections, 2925 Euclid Avenue by 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, November 2nd.
