SCAMMERS TARGET SENIORS

HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO HELP YOU STAY SAFER.

Scammers are targeting people over 60 years old more frequently, and they're using the phone, computer, and paper mail. Here are five tips to help you avoid falling for their tricks.

- 1. Recognize urgency as a red flag.** Phrases like "right now" or "there's not time" can be a clue that something is not right. Take a pause before taking any action.
- 2. Never give out personal information to a caller.** You can always take the time to hang up, look up an official number, and call to verify the situation.
- 3. Be wary of clicking links in emails or text messages.** These messages could be fakes, designed to steal your login info when you click. Open a web browser and type in the website address yourself.
- 4. Don't repeat passwords across accounts** If you do get tricked into giving your username or password for a website, fraudsters will use them to try to log into your other accounts.
- 5. Consult someone you trust.** Scammers count on you being too emotional to think clearly. Always reach out to someone you trust - a relative or attorney - to get a second opinion.

FALLS...THE DOWNFALL OF MANY SENIORS



According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention:

- One in four Americans aged 65+ falls each year.
- Every 11 seconds, an older adult is treated in the emergency room for a fall; every 19 minutes, an older adult dies from a fall.
- Falls are the leading cause of fatal injury and the most common cause of nonfatal trauma-related hospital admissions among older adults.
- Falls result in more than 2.8 million injuries treated in emergency departments annually, including over 800,000 hospitalizations and more than 27,000 deaths.
- Medicare and Medicaid shouldered 75% of these costs.
- The financial toll for older adult falls is expected to increase as the population ages and may reach \$67.7 billion by 2020.

Growing older makes Seniors more likely to fall for several reasons. Some of the most common physical causes are chronic health conditions, such as heart disease, dementia and low blood pressure (hypotension), which can cause dizziness. Falls have a physical impact that can lead to pain, disability and even death. But they also have a psychological impact. For many older adults, the fear of falling is so pervasive that it makes them become prisoners in their own homes. This causes them to limit social activities and become more isolated.

Following are just a few of the steps that can be taken to protect your steps, as you age:

- Keep the home well lit, as darkness and shadows can be deceiving, especially to one with diminishing eyesight
- Make sure walkways are open and free of clutter
- Limit or remove throw rugs, as these may move and are a tripping hazard
- Have handrails on both sides of the stairways
- Add grab bars in appropriate areas such as near stairs and in the bathroom
- Use adaptive devices such as shower chairs and raised commodes, to help maintain stability
- In the bath or shower put nonskid mats on the floor surface
- Wear an electronic pendant with a button to push to call for help
- Take regular exercise classes to increase strength and balance, such as yoga and tai chi
- Drink adequate water, as dehydration may cause dizziness
- Eat foods rich in Vitamin D to increase muscle strength
- Get screened for osteoporosis. If needed follow your physician's direction to treat
- Get regular eye exams and wear glasses if prescribed
- If directed by your physician, use walking aides such as canes or walkers
- Wear sensible shoes with non-skid soles

While the danger of falls, especially in the elderly, is well understood, the good news is that there are ways to reduce and prevent them. The important message is that steps can be taken to save lives and improve the quality of life. With a little planning and taking appropriate steps, the threat of falls can be reduced, increasing one's opportunity for sustaining a more independent lifestyle. *Source: National Council on Aging*

2019-20 Senior Snow Removal Program **OUTLINE**

ELIGIBILITY

- You must be age 65 or older with no other household member under the age of 65, or
- You are disabled with no other household member under the age of 65. A current letter from your doctor, on their letterhead, explaining your disability must be submitted with your application.

COST

- There will be a charge of \$150 per senior household, for the service. A check, payable to Village of Brooklyn Heights, or exact cash will be accepted (we do not have the ability to give change).
- There will be a discount for any senior that has been approved for the 2019-20 Federal HEAP program. Proof of participation in the HEAP program must be submitted in the form of your current year acceptance letter and/or a copy of a current gas bill with the HEAP discount listed. The cost will be \$60. The discount will be applied once your HEAP acceptance letter is received.

IMPORTANT NOTES

- This service should be supplemental to a service you employ if you need to be out of your drive at a certain time.
- This is a basic snow plowing service. In severe weather conditions, plowing may be delayed.

OUTLINE

- Your street address must be visible from the street.
- If a car is in your driveway while plowing occurs, this will limit the area which will be plowed.
- The driveways are plowed in an assigned order. If the house around the corner is plowed before yours, please be sure that your street will be done in a timely manner. If you have a corner lot, your drive will be plowed by the truck handling your street address.
- If your sidewalk or the street is plowed by the Village after the subcontractor has plowed your drive, we cannot get back out and re-do all of the drives.
- If your drive has been cleared by someone else before the contractor has been there, the contractor will skip your house as it "appears to have been cleared".
- If your drive is missed or there are any problems, please call the Community Service office - on the day of the occurrence. All calls should be made to 739-3702. Messages will be returned as soon as possible. Please do not call the sub-contractor or the Service Department.
- If any damage occurs please notify the Community Service Department immediately. Any damage to lawns and/or sprinkler systems, etc. must be reported to the Community Services Department no later than May 15, 2020. No reports will be honored after this date.

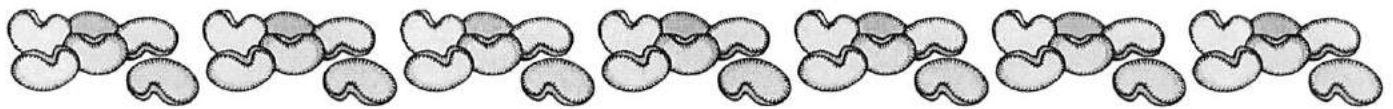

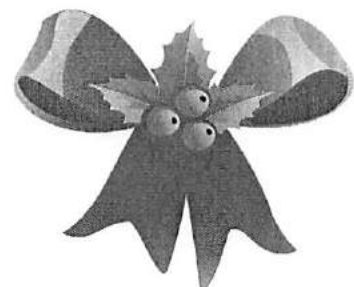

How To Recycle in Cuyahoga County: Back to the Basics

July 30, 2019 – Cleveland, Ohio – Recycling contamination is at issue across the nation and world, but is also a major problem here in Cuyahoga County. Many local and national media outlets are reporting on how we've been affected by China's new environmental policies and the best ways to recycle properly.

Recycling contamination happens when well-intended recyclers mistakenly put the wrong items into their recycling. It can wreak havoc on the recycling process in Cuyahoga County and throughout the world.

Here in Cuyahoga County, the best way to avoid recycling contamination in your curbside recycling is to recycle only these five core items:

- [CANS](#): Empty and rinse.
- [CARTONS](#): Empty and rinse. Replace the cap -- it's too small to be recycled by itself!
- [GLASS BOTTLES & JARS](#): Empty and rinse.
- [PAPER & BOXES](#): Flatten cardboard items, like cereal boxes, to save space.
- [PLASTIC BOTTLES & JUGS](#): Empty and rinse. Replace the cap.

Place these items loose – not bagged – in your recycling bin or cart. All items should be empty, clean and dry. Plastic bottles and jugs includes items with an opening or neck that is narrower than the body.
