The First Aid Program meets the requirements for NIMS credentialing for First Aid and continuing education for Ohio Responds.

The First Aid Program consists of:

- American Heart Association Heartsaver First Aid
- American Heart Association Heartsaver CPR AED
- American Heart Association Bloodborne Pathogens

First Aid and CPR/AED will be scheduled in one session because both courses are combined into one Student Workbook. Bloodborne Pathogens will be scheduled separately.

Length of Courses (Approximate)

• Bloodborne Pathogens: 1.5 hours

• First Aid and CPR/AED: 7 hours, including lunch and breaks, excluding remediation

Minimum and Maximum Enrollment

- □ First Aid/CPR/AED: 4-8
- □ Bloodborne Pathogens: 10-25 (Recommended)

Requirements to Receive a Card

- Students must be active members of a CERT in Cuyahoga County.
- Students must attend the entire session. Latecomers may not be admitted.
- Students must be able to perform First Aid/CPR/AED skills on the floor.
- Students with medical/physical concerns should have a release from their physician.
- Students will be tested individually and remediated, if necessary
